- Exposed sharp obstructions or objects
- Exposure to the elements
- Unsanitary conditions such as unclean chicken coops or pigeon lofts
- Unsanitary conditions such as accumulated feces, decaying food, muddy or wet ground substrate
- Discoloration of walls to indicate bacterial build up.
