DIRECTIONS TO HYAK LODGE, SNOQUALMIE SUMMIT

The Hyak Lodge is located on the Eastern edge of Snoqualmie Pass, in the heart of the Wenatchee National Forrest, and is conveniently situated just off of Interstate - 90.

To get there from the Seattle area (Western Washington):

Take I-90 east to exit 54, take a right at the first stop sign. At the next stop sign, make a left onto State Route 906. Travel ½ mile and make a right turn on Keechelus Boat Launch Road. Go .3 miles to Hyak, marked by a cedar sign on the left side of the road.

To get there from Eastern Washington:

Take I-90 west to exit 54. At the bottom of the exit ramp, make a left and go under the freeway interchange. At the stop sign, make a left onto State Route 906. Travel ½ mile and make a right turn on Keechelus Boat Launch Road. Go .3 miles to Hyak, marked by a cedar sign on the left side of the road
