NEW SECTION

WAC 220-56-23000I Bottomfish closed areas.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-56-230, WAC 220-56-235, and WAC 220-56-250, effective immediately through June 15, 2011, it is unlawful to take, fish for or possess bottomfish seaward of 30 fathoms in Marine Area 2, except that effective May 11 through June 15, 2011, a person may fish for and possess sablefish, Pacific Cod and rockfish seaward of 30 fathoms in Marine Area 2.

The following coordinates define the 30-fathom line:

47°31.70'N lat.	124°37.03'W long.;
47°25.67'N lat.	124°34.79'W long.;
47°12.82'N lat.	124°29.12'W long.;
46°52.94'N lat.	124°22.58'W long.;
46°44.18'N lat.	124°18.00'W long.;
46°38.17'N lat.	124°15.88'W long.

REPEALER
