EMERGENCY RULE

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal year 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: The Grays Harbor Poggie Club is sponsoring a Kids' Fishing Derby at Failor Lake one week prior to the opening of the lowland lake season. In previous years, the derby has been held on opening day for the lowland lake season, but congestion and competition from adult anglers interferes with the kids' enjoyment of the derby and the smooth operations of the derby. An emergency rule is needed to open the lake for the derby one week early. There is insufficient time to adopt a permanent rule.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18000A Exceptions to statewide rules—Failor Lake (Grays Harbor Co.)

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, Failor Lake is open to fishing on April 19, 2014, from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. for anglers age fourteen years old and younger who are participating in the youth fishing event. Adults may assist children participating in the event, but no child may fish with more than one fishing rod. All other provisions of the permanent rule remain in effect.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed, effective 12:01 p.m. April 19, 2014:

WAC 220-310-18000A Exceptions to statewide rules—Failor Lake (Grays Harbor Co.)

EMERGENCY RULE ONLY

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

(x) That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.

() That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.

() That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal years 2009, 2010, or 2011, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: The Grays Harbor Poggie Club sponsors a Kids' Fishing Derby at Failor Lake. In previous years, the kids derby was held on opening day for the lowland lake season causing congestion on the lake and affected the kids' enjoyment of the derby. As a result of moving the derby to the Saturday prior to opening day the derby operated far more smoothly, engaged more kids, and was perceived to be very successful. An emergency rule is needed to open the lake for the derby to occur one week prior to the general opening day. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
