EMERGENCY RULE

Under RCW 34.05.350 the agency for good cause finds:

- That immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule is necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety, or general welfare, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the public interest.
- That state or federal law or federal rule or a federal deadline for state receipt of federal funds requires immediate adoption of a rule.
- That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal year 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

Reasons for this finding: Low water and higher than normal water temperatures are causing a delay in migration and increased stress on wild salmon returning to the Quillayute system, making them more vulnerable to fishing pressure. The Quileute Tribe has also closed its fishery for two weeks, and will re-assess the situation at that time. These closures are needed to protect wild Chinook and coho salmon. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-310-18000U Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Coastal

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-310-180, effective August 1, 2015, until further notice the following waters are closed to all fishing:

- (1) Bogachiel River (Clallam Co.) and all tributaries outside Olympic National Park
- (2) Calawah River (Clallam Co.) and all tributaries outside Olympic National Park
- (3) Dickey River (Clallam Co.) and all tributaries outside Olympic National Park
- (4) Sol Duc River (Clallam Co.) and all tributaries outside Olympic National Park
- (5) Quillayute River (Clallam Co.), from the confluence of the Sol Duc and Bogachiel Rivers downstream 475 yards to fluorescent orange paint on rocks.

REPEALER

The following section of the Washington Administrative Code is repealed effective August 1, 2015:
