- That in order to implement the requirements or reductions in appropriations enacted in any budget for fiscal year 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, or 2013, which necessitates the need for the immediate adoption, amendment, or repeal of a rule, and that observing the time requirements of notice and opportunity to comment upon adoption of a permanent rule would be contrary to the fiscal needs or requirements of the agency.

This emergency rule modifies salmon fisheries to ensure compliance with ESA take coverage for Chinook and steelhead until a permit is approved. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

NEW SECTION

WAC 232-28-62100C Puget Sound salmon—saltwater seasons and daily limits.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 232-28-621, effective May 1, 2016, until further notice, it is unlawful to fish for salmon in Marine Area 8-2 (including Tulalip Terminal Area Fishery), Marine Area 11, Marine Area 13, and year-round piers (Marine Areas 9, 10, 11, and 13) . Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect.

WAC 220-56-51000C Game fish possession limits and size limits.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-56-510, effective May 1, 2016, until further notice, it is unlawful to retain steelhead in Marine Areas 5, 6, 7, 8-1, 8-2, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 13. Unless otherwise amended, all permanent rules remain in effect.
