

WDFW's Mark-Selective Fisheries

Declining wild Chinook and coho salmon populations require conservation measures to protect these stocks. WDFW can meet conservation goals while providing opportunities to catch hatchery fish by implementing selective fishery techniques. Monitoring catches, educating fishers, and enforcing compliance are vital to rebuilding wild stocks while allowing for harvest of hatchery salmon.
