




Recreational History



- Private Resort: 1960s-1990s
- WDFW Acquired in 1996
- Rail Launch Closed in 2002

◎ Habitat Mitigation





◎ Potential Impacts on Treaty Fishing Rights

- ◎ Mitigation Design Done


Logan Project

- Acquired June 2015
- 100' Bulkhead Removal in Summer 2016

Whitford Project

- Acquired Aug 2015
- 400' Bulkhead Removal in Late 2016/Early 2017

- ◎ Estimate ~ 2 months for Construction



Permitting Status

- ⦿ Dec 2011: Kitsap County Shoreline Development Permit
 - 24 Permit Conditions
 - MOU with Kitsap County

- ⦿ Nov 2013: Applied for Corps of Engineers Permit
 - Jan 2014: Corps Suspended Action on Permit Application Due to Tribal Concerns

● Whitford Cons Easement	\$ 100K
● Mitigation Permit/Design	40K

Recent Actions

◎ WDFW Letter to Corps

- Prompt Action on Nov 2013 Permit Application
- Provide Context for Tribal Concerns

◎ Suquamish Tribal Letter to WDFW Requesting

1. Project scope reduced to hand launch of small vessels (max 14-16') only or compensation to address treaty impacts
2. The Tribe have unrestricted 24 hour access to the launch for subsistence and commercial fisheries, including sales
3. A 40-year sunset: After that, remove structure or revisit

- *Until These Issues Are Resolved, the Suquamish Tribe Cannot Support the Proposed Project*

Proposed Next Steps

- WDFW Respond to Suquamish Tribe and Continue to Attempt to Resolve Issues
- Follow Up with Corps on Tribal Correspondence and Continue to Prompt Action on Permit Application
