There is currently a 6 month non permanent employment opportunity with the Habitat Program, TAPPS Division located at the Natural Resources Building in Olympia, Washington. The position will be located at the Sunset Falls Trap and Haul fishway in Snohomish County.

Position: Maintenance Mechanic 2
Salary: Range 46g, \$3549.00 to \$4014.00 monthly depending on qualifications
Duty Station: the Natural Resources Building (NRB) located in Olympia, Thurston County
Anticipated Start and End Dates: ASAP – 12/31/2009

This position will be responsible for the operation, maintenance, evaluation and safe handling and hauling of key fish species (including ESA listed species) at the Sunset Falls Trap & Haul fishway. Responsible for the operation and maintenance of the Granite Falls fishway.

Working Conditions:

- Must be flexible to meet the needs (haul) of fish returning to the Sunset Falls fishway trap
- Willing to work in an isolated environment for an extended period
- Be on station and standby Monday through Friday (24 hours/5days a week)

Required Qualifications:

- Class "A" CDL with "Tanker" endorsement
- Experience that demonstrates general knowledge of truck air systems, engines and drive trains
- Experience that demonstrates general knowledge of the operating and maintenance of bridge cranes
- Experience that demonstrates general knowledge of the operations and maintenance of emergency diesel generators and electrical systems
- Experience that demonstrates the safe operation and maintenance of a 2.5 ton/1,000 gallon tank truck including the operation of an oxygen, pump/aeration system for fish hauling
- Experience that demonstrates the overall safe handling and hauling of fish on a public road system and all the laws pertaining to the operation of the aforementioned tank truck
