<i>Treaty Indian Gillnet Fishery</i>		
Dates:	6:00 AM Monday, October 11 to 6:00 PM Wednesday, October 13	2.5 days
Area:	Zone 6	
Gear:	Gillnet. 8 inch minimum mesh size restriction.	
Sanctuaries:	All Standard river mouth and dam sanctuaries applicable to these gear types are in effect, EXCEPT for the Spring Creek Hatchery Sanctuary.	
Allowable Sales:	Salmon, steelhead, walleye, shad, yellow perch, catfish, bass and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be sold. Sturgeon between 43-54 inches in fork length in The Dalles and John Day pools and between 38-54 inches in fork length in the Bonneville Pool may be retained for subsistence.	
Note:	24-hour Quick reporting rule in effect for Washington buyers	

- **Columbia River above and below Bonneville Platform and Hook and Line Fishery:**

Fish caught after 6:00 p.m. October 17, 2010 may not be sold, and may only be kept for subsistence purposes.

- **Yakama Nation Fisheries in Columbia River Tributaries above Bonneville Dam:**

For salmon, walleye, shad, yellow perch, catfish, bass and carp caught **after 6:00 p.m. October 17**, transport permits will be required in order to sell fish outside the fishing areas.

SALES OF STEELHEAD ARE PROHIBITED (for fish caught after 6:00 p.m. October 17).

Steelhead may be retained for subsistence purposes. Sturgeon may not be sold. Sturgeon between 43-54 inches in fork length in The Dalles and John Day pools and between 38-54 inches in fork length in the Bonneville Pool may be retained for subsistence.

24-hour Quick reporting rule is in effect for Washington buyers.
