| Multi- Net | Nets not specifically authorized for use in this fishery may be onboard the vessel if properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope with a diameter of 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater. | |
| Allowable Sales: | Chinook, coho, white sturgeon, and shad. A maximum of three white sturgeon may be possessed or sold by each participating vessel during each calendar week (Sunday through Saturday) that the fishery is open. | |
| Additional: | A 24-hour quick reporting rule is in effect for Washington buyers. | |

Sturgeon between 43-54 inches in fork length in The Dalles and John Day pools may be retained for subsistence. Sturgeon between 38-54 inches in fork length in the Bonneville pool may be retained for subsistence. | |

- **Columbia River Tributaries above Bonneville Dam:**

6:00 AM. June 16, 2010 until further notice on days when the Zone 6 platform and hook and line fishery is open and only during those days and hours when the tributaries listed below are open under lawfully enacted Yakama Nation tribal subsistence fishery regulations for enrolled Yakama Nation members. Commercial sales of fish caught in Yakama Nation tributary fisheries are allowed. The allowed species for sale would coincide with the mainstem fisheries.

24-hour Quick reporting rule is in effect for Washington buyers.

The general fishing schedule for these tributaries is:

| 1. Wind River: noon Mondays through 6:00 PM Saturdays until June 26. |
| 2. Big White Salmon River: noon Mondays through 6:00 PM Saturday all year. |
| 3. Klickitat River: noon Tuesdays through 6:00 PM Saturdays until December 25. |
| 4. Icicle Creek 6:00 AM Tuesdays through 6:00 PM Saturdays until July 24. |
| Weekly fishing schedules are subject to modification based on catches and run sizes. |

- **Columbia River below Bonneville Dam:**

SEASON: 6:00 AM. June 16, 2010 until further notice, on days when the Zone 6 platform and hook and line fishery is open. Under the conditions described in the 2007 Memo of Agreement (MOA) with the Yakama Nation (YN) and under the conditions described in the 2010 MOU (Memo of Understanding) with the Confederated Tribes of the Umatilla Indian Reservation (CTUIR) and the 2010 MOU with the Confederated Tribes of the Warm Spring Reservation (CTWS).

AREA: As described in individual MOA/MOUs.

SALES: Coincide with the mainstem fisheries, except sturgeon retention prohibited (no sales or C&S). No Sales of fish allowed on USACE property at Bonneville Dam.

24-hour Quick reporting rule is in effect for Washington buyers.
