Area:	Zones 4-5	
Sanctuaries:	Grays River, Elokom-B, Cowlitz River, Kalama-B, Lewis-B, Washougal, and Sandy Rivers as applicable	
Gear:	Drift gillnets only. 9" minimum mesh size restriction.  Nets not specifically authorized for use in this fishery may be onboard the vessel if properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope with a diameter of 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater.  Nets fished any time between official sunset and official sunrise must have lighted buoys on both ends of the net. If the net is attached to the boat, then one lighted buoy on the end of the net opposite the boat is required.	
Allowable Sales:	Salmon and white sturgeon. A maximum of <b>four</b> white sturgeon may be possessed or sold by each participating vessel during each calendar week (Sunday through Saturday) that the fishery is open. The white sturgeon possession and sales limit includes mainstem fisheries only.	
Additional Rules:	<b>24-hour</b> Quick Reporting Rule will be in effect for Washington buyers.

Dates:	6:00 AM Tuesday, August 24 to 6:00 PM Friday, August 27	3.5 days
	6:00 AM Monday, August 30 to 6:00 PM Friday September 3	4.5 days
	6:00 AM Tuesday, September 7 to 6:00 PM Friday, September 10	3.5 days
Area:	Zone 6	
Gear:	No minimum mesh size restriction.	
Sanctuaries:	Standard river mouth and dam sanctuaries applicable to these gear types in effect, except the small Spring Creek Hatchery sanctuary will be in effect (150 ft radius around hatchery ladder).	
Allowable Sales:	Salmon, steelhead, walleye, shad, yellow perch, bass, and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 43 to 54 inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day Pools, and from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool, may be kept for subsistence purposes. Sales of fish caught during the open period for gillnet fishing are allowed after the end of the open period as long as the fish were landed during the open period.
