<i>2013 Treaty Indian Fall Chinook Zone 6 Platform/Hook and Line Fishery</i>	
Season:	6:00 AM August 12, 2013 until further notice
Area	SMCRA 1F, 1G, 1H (Zone 6).
Gear:	Hoop nets, dip nets, set bag nets, and rod and reel with hook and line.
Sanctuaries:	Standard sanctuaries in effect for this gear type.
Allowable Sales:	Salmon, steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp which may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 43 to 54 inches fork length in The Dalles and John Day Pools and from 38 to 54 inches fork length in the Bonneville Pool may be kept for subsistence purposes.
<i>2013 Treaty Indian Platform Hook and Line below Bonneville Dam</i>	
Season	Effective 6:00 AM August 12, 2013 until further notice: Open fishing times as prescribed in tribal MOUs/MOAs and all other tribal regulations.
Area:	SMCRA 1E, immediately downstream of Bonneville Dam in open areas as prescribed in tribal MOUs/MOAs and all other tribal regulations
Gear:	Bank fishing with hoop nets, dip nets, set bag nets, and rod and reel with hook and line consistent with tribal regulations.
Allowable Sales:	Salmon, steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon retention is prohibited; sturgeon may not be sold or retained for ceremonial or subsistence purposes. Sales may not occur on USACE property.
<i>2013 Yakama Nation Tributary Fisheries</i>	
Season	Effective 6:00 AM August 12, 2013 until further notice: Open only during those days and hours when the tributaries listed below are open under lawfully enacted Yakama Nation tribal subsistence fishery regulations for enrolled Yakama Nation members.
Area:	Drano Lake and Klickitat River
Gear:	Hoop nets, dip nets, set bag nets, and rod and reel with hook and line. Gillnets may only be used in Drano Lake.
Allowable Sales:	Salmon, steelhead, shad, yellow perch, bass, walleye, catfish and carp which may be sold or retained for subsistence. Sturgeon may not be sold, but sturgeon from 38 to 54 inches fork length may be kept for subsistence purposes.

For all fisheries listed above: **24-hour quick reporting** required for Washington buyers, pursuant to WAC 220-69-240.
