# COLUMBIA RIVER COMPACT/JOINT STATE ACTION NOTICE - *Revised*

Revises the September 24 notice regarding clarification of retention of jacks in the Buoy 10 area:

<i>2013 Columbia River Fall Chinook Recreational Fishery</i>	
<i>Buoy 10 upstream to Warrior Rock line</i>	
<b>Season :</b>	Effective September 26, 2013
<b>Daily bag limit:</b>	Two adult salmon or steelhead. All other permanent rules apply, including no retention of Chinook jacks (<24-inches) downstream of the Tongue Point-Rocky Point line until October 1. Release wild coho and wild steelhead.
<b>Area</b>	Buoy 10 upstream to the Warrior Rock line (a line from the Warrior Rock Lighthouse on the Oregon shore through red buoy #4 to the orange marker atop the dolphin on the Washington shore).

**Future Hearings:** The next Columbia River Compact is scheduled for 4:00 PM Thursday, September 26 to review stock status and consider additional non-Indian and treaty commercial fisheries
