### THE FOLLOWING ACTION WAS TAKEN:

#### *Bonneville Pool*

Effective 6:00 a.m. Saturday March 1, 2014: Legal size sturgeon in Bonneville Pool are fish within 38-54 inches in fork length.

Effective 6:00 p.m. Wednesday March 12, 2014: The winter gillnet fishery in The Bonneville Pool will close. The sale of legal fish landed prior to the closure is allowed.

- The platform and hook and line fishery in Bonneville Pool remain open for subsistence use when commercial seasons are closed. Sturgeon within 43-54 inches in fork length may be retained for subsistence purposes during closed commercial periods in Bonneville Pool.

#### *The Dalles Pool*

Effective 6:00 p.m. Monday March 3, 2014: The winter gillnet fishery in The Dalles Pool will close. The sale of legal fish landed prior to the closure is allowed.

The following season was set:

**Season:** 6:00 AM Thursday March 13 until 6:00 p.m. Saturday March 22, 2014.

**Area:** The Dalles Pool

**Allowable sales:** Salmon, steelhead, sturgeon, shad, carp, catfish, walleye, bass, and yellow perch. Legal size sturgeon (between 43-54 inches in fork length) may be sold or retained for subsistence purposes. Release of all oversize and under-size sturgeon is required. Sales of platform/hook-and-line caught fish can be sold during open commercial seasons. Fish caught during open commercial periods can be sold after the season closes.

**Sanctuaries** – As applicable, river mouth and dam sanctuaries remain in effect.

**Gear:** Gill nets, hoop nets, dip bag nets, and rod and reel with hook and line are permissible. There is no mesh restriction on gillnets.

**Miscellaneous:** 24-hour quick reporting required for Washington wholesale dealers, WAC 220-69-240

- The platform and hook and line fishery in The Dalles and John Day Pool remain open for subsistence use. Sturgeon between 43-54 inches in fork length may be retained for subsistence purposes.
