## THE FOLLOWING SEASONS WERE SET:

<i>2014 Non-Indian Mainstem Commercial Fisheries</i>	
<b>Season #1:</b> <i>(Coho-directed)</i>	Open daily from 7:00 AM to 7:00 PM (5 Periods, 12 hours each) Monday October 27 through Friday October 31, 2014
Area:	Zones 1-3. Upper deadline defined as a straight line projected from the Warrior Rock Lighthouse on the Oregon shore easterly through the green navigation Buoy #1 and continuing to the Washington shore.
Sanctuaries:	<b>Grays Bay</b> , Elokommin-A, Cowlitz River, Kalama-A and Lewis-A
Gear:	Drift nets only. 6-inch maximum mesh. Unslackened floater drift net.
<b>Season #2:</b> <i>(Chinook directed)</i>	Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday nights. (3 periods, 12 hours each) October 26 through October 31, 2014 Open hours: 7 PM-7 AM
Area:	Zones 4-5. Lower deadline defined as a straight line projected from the Warrior Rock Lighthouse on the Oregon shore easterly through the green navigation Buoy #1 and continuing to the Washington shore
Sanctuaries:	Washougal and Sandy Rivers
Gear:	Drift gillnets only. 8-inch minimum mesh size restriction.
<b>The following applies to all seasons:</b>	
Allowable Sales:	Salmon, except chum salmon may not be possessed or sold.
Additional Rules:	<p><u>Multiple net rule in effect:</u> Nets not specifically authorized for use in this fishery may be onboard the vessel if properly stored. A properly stored net is defined as a net on a drum that is fully covered by a tarp (canvas or plastic) and bound with a minimum of ten revolutions of rope with a diameter of 3/8 (0.375) inches or greater.</p> <p><u>Lighted Buoys required:</u> Nets that are fished at any time between official sunset and official sunrise must have lighted buoys on both ends of the net unless the net is attached to the boat. If the net is attached to the boat, then one lighted buoy on the opposite end of the net from the boat is required</p> <p><u>24-hour quick reporting required</u> for Washington wholesale dealers, per WAC 220-69-240. Submission of a report is not complete until the report arrives at the designated department location.</p> <p>Reports can be made via fax at 360-906-6776 or 360-906-6777; via e-mail at crfishtickets@dfw.wa.gov; or via phone at 1- 866-791-1281.</p> <p>Faxing or reporting electronically in portable document format (PDF) a copy of each fish receiving ticket used, within the previously indicated time frames specified per area, satisfies the quick reporting requirement.</p>
