
COLUMBIA RIVER COMPACT/JOINT STATE ACTION NOTICE

THE FOLLOWING ACTION WAS TAKEN:

<i>2015 Buoy 10 Recreational Fishery</i>	
Action:	Effective Monday August 24 through Monday September 7: only Chinook with a clipped adipose fin and a healed scar at the location of the fin may be retained.
Daily Bag Limit:	Chinook minimum size 24-inches. Coho minimum size 16-inches. Daily limit is 2 adipose fin-clipped salmon or steelhead or 1 of each. Only 1 Chinook may be retained. Release all salmon other than adipose fin-clipped Chinook and adipose fin-clipped Coho.
Additional:	Fishers participating in the adjacent fisheries may have unclipped Chinook onboard while in transit through the Buoy 10 area per permanent regulations.
Area:	From a true north and south line through Buoy 10 upstream to a projected line from Rocky Point of the Washington Shore through Red Buoy # 44 to the navigation light at Tongue Point on the Oregon bank.

- The fishery is expected to continue as scheduled beginning September 8.
- No hearings are currently scheduled. The next hearing date may be as early as August 26 to review non-Indian fisheries.
