
COLUMBIA RIVER COMPACT ACTION NOTICE

THE FOLLOWING ACTION WAS TAKEN:

<i>2016 Buoy 10 Recreational Fishery</i>	
Action:	Effective through September 30 : Retention of <u>hatchery</u> Chinook is allowed.
Area:	From a true north and south line through Buoy 10 upstream to the Tongue Point/Rocky Point deadline.
Daily Bag Limit:	Daily limit is two salmonids of which only one may be a hatchery Chinook. Only one hatchery steelhead may be retained per day. Release all salmon other than hatchery (adipose or left-ventral fin clipped) Chinook and adipose fin-clipped Coho. Chinook minimum size is 24 inches and Coho minimum size is 16 inches. All other permanent rules apply.

<i>2016 LCR Recreational Fisheries – Tongue Point Upstream to Warrior Rock</i>	
Action:	Effective through September 30 : Retention of <u>hatchery</u> Chinook is allowed.
Area:	From a line projected from Rocky Point on the Washington bank through Red Buoy 44 to the navigation light at Tongue Point on the Oregon bank upstream to the Warrior Rock deadline.
Daily Bag Limit:	Daily limit is six fish, but only two may be adults and only one of those adults may be a hatchery Chinook. Only one hatchery steelhead may be retained per day. Release all salmon other than hatchery (adipose or left-ventral fin clipped) Chinook and adipose fin-clipped Coho. Minimum size is 12 inches. All other permanent rules apply.

- A hearing is scheduled for 11:00 a.m. Thursday September 29 via teleconference to consider treaty commercial fisheries, non-Indian commercial fisheries, and review ongoing recreational fisheries.
