Columbia River Compact/ Joint State Action Notice

August 18, 2000

THE FOLLOWING COLUMBIA RIVER SEASONS WERE SET:

NON-INDIAN COMMERCIAL SALMON FISHERY

- Area: I-205 Bridge upstream to Beacon Rock with the modified Washougal sanctuary below.
- Sanctuaries: Modified Washougal Sanctuary means those waters of the Columbia River and Camas Slough upstream from a line projecting from flashing light 1 on the Washington shore (approximately 4.5 miles upstream of the I-205 Bridge) to Navigational marker 2 on the lower end of Sand Island thence south to Government Island, and a line from the upper end of Government Island south to the upper end of McGuire Island thence south to the Oregon shore, and downstream of a line projected true north-south through the Washougal blinker light (light A50") to a fishing boundary marker on the Washington shore and to the Oregon shore.
- Dates: 8 PM Monday Aug 21 to 6 AM Tuesday Aug 22 (10 hours)
8 PM Tuesday Aug 22 to 6 AM Wednesday Aug 23 (10 hours)
8 PM Wednesday Aug 23 to 6 AM Thursday Aug 24 (10 hours)
- Gear: 9" minimum and 9-3/4" maximum mesh size restrictions
- Allowable Sale: Sturgeon and salmon
- NOTE: There is a possibility of an early closure or extension of this fishery. Checkpoints will occur daily with information available about 1PM daily.

Next Compact is scheduled for September 8 at 10 AM at Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife in Portland.

THE FOLLOWING COLUMBIA RIVER TREATY INDIAN SEASONS WERE SET:

TREATY INDIAN COMMERCIAL SALMON FISHERY

Area: Zone 6

Sanctuaries: One and one half miles downstream and one half mile upstream from the Spring Creek hatchery ladder

Dates: 6 AM Wednesday August 30, 2000 to 6 PM Saturday September 2, 2000
6 AM Tuesday September 5, 2000 to 6 PM Saturday September 9, 2000

Gear: No mesh restriction.

Allowable Sale: Salmon, steelhead, walleye and shad
