Columbia River Compact/ Joint State Action Notice Washington Dept. of Fish and Wildlife

April 20, 2001

THE FOLLOWING COLUMBIA RIVER SEASONS WERE SET:

TREATY INDIAN COMMERCIAL SEASON

Area: All of Zone 6

Dates: 6:00 AM, Thursday, April 26, 2001 through 6:00 PM, Saturday, April 28

Gear: No mesh restriction

Allowable Sale: Salmon, steelhead, walleye and shad. Sturgeon sales are not allowed. Sturgeon between 4 feet and 5 feet may be retained for subsistence.

Sanctuaries: All standard sancturaries remain in effect with the exception of the Spring Creek Hatchery Sanctuary.

TREATY INDIAN COMMERCIAL SEASON

Area: All of Zone 6, Wind River, Drano Lake, Klickitat River

Dates: 6:00 AM, Saturday, April 21, 2001 through 6:00 PM, Thursday, May 31

Gear: Hoop nets, dip-bag nets and hook and line. Set nets allowed in Drano Lake only.

Allowable Sale: Salmon, steelhead, walleye and shad. Sturgeon sales are not allowed. Sturgeon between 4 feet and 5 feet may be retained for subsistence.

Other: Fish may be sold from Wind River, Drano Lake, and Klickitat River during those times when Wind River, Drano Lake and Klickitat River have open seasons.

Sanctuaries: All standard sancturaries remain in effect with the exception of the Spring Creek Hatchery Sanctuary.

The next COMPACT meeting has been scheduled for May 2, 2001 time and location to

be determined.

Mainstem Columbia River Spring Chinook sport fishery:

The mainstem Columbia River from the mouth upstream to Bonneville Dam will reopen effective Wednesday, April 25, 2001 through Sunday, April 29, 2001 for spring Chinook, Steelhead, and Shad.

A conference call will be scheduled to discuss run size updates and fishery catches to determine if further fishing may occur.
