The objective of this project is to inventory passage and screening needs associated with water diversions in the Okanogan and Methow basins. All fish bearing streams will be walked and all artificial barriers and diversions will be assessed using standard WDFW protocols. This inventory will provide a basis to set priorities for screening and passage improvements and for estimating the nature of improvements needed at each site.

Cooperative Compliance, Touchet Project Phase 1

The objectives of this grant are to complete design of a fish screen and passage facility on the Touchet River in Dayton, Washington. A second phase will fund construction. When the construction phase is completed it will consolidate three points of diversion into one which is screened to current state and federal criteria, provides passage over the structure with a fish ladder, and eliminates seasonal push-up dams. Native steelhead, bull trout, whitefish, bridgelip suckers, and other native species will be protected from entrainment and allowed to migrate up and down-stream according to their individual life history requirements.
