Help Restore Habitat At The Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge



Join us for restoration volunteer work days on the Refuge. Work days are open to all. Please register in advance. To register or get on our notice list, contact Lori Summers or Lynn Cornelius, (360) 887-3883, lori_summers@fws.gov. Additional work days may also be arranged for groups.

All work days are from **9 am to 12:30 pm**, rain or shine.

Unless otherwise noted, for all work days wear **waterproof footwear**, bring **gloves**, **water**, a **snack**, and **dress for the weather** with raingear or sun protection.

INVASIVE PLANT REMOVAL - IRIS

Wed. April 21, Wed. May 19, & Sat. June 5. Meet at River S Unit Kiosk. We will dig the invasive wetland plant yellow flag iris from slough edges and wetlands and pile for removal by truck. We may also cut or pull other species. Shovels and other tools will be provided. *Please wear rubber boots.*

INVASIVE PLANT REMOVAL - BULRUSH


Saturdays and Wednesdays: June 23, 26, 30; Jul 7, 10, 14, 17, 21, 24, 28, 31; Aug 4, 7, 11, 14, 18, 21, 25, 28; & Sept 1. Meet at River S Unit Kiosk. We will pull ricefield bulrush (the highest priority wetland invasive plant threat on the refuge) and other species, bag plants, and load on to a truck for removal.
