

Existing Uses	Open space wetland mitigation
Threats	Protected as a mitigation site
Intended Uses	This acquisition would be under the management of the Snoqualmie Wildlife Area. This is a Washington State Department of Transportation mitigation site. Provides potential alternative to leasing private lands for parking area.
Project Description	Acquisition would allow WDFW to provide boat access to the middle lobe of Ebey Island. Providing this access will increase waterfowl hunting and passive recreation. This parcel would be utilized for public access. Ebey Slough is designated as critical habitat for Chinook and bull trout. The site is located within the Pacific Flyway for waterfowl migration.
