Threats	Development
Intended Uses	Primary uses include water access for fishing and pheasant release site. The site provides working lands, agriculture. This parcel will become part of the Snoqualmie Wildlife Area.
Project Description	Replacement lands for land impacted by estuary restoration, including replacement of upland bird habitat for recreation hunting. Major waterfowl stopover and overwinter location as part of the International Pacific Flyway. Provides riparian and wetland habitat. Species include: coho, critical habitat for ESA listed Chinook salmon and steelhead.
