

Recreational land to mitigate for bridge realignment

WDFW is seeking public comment through March 25 on 3 acres of land the department purchased near Sultan in Snohomish County for recreational access to the Wallace River. The property can be easily accessed from Highway 2 and provides for fishing and wildlife viewing. In addition, hand-carried boats and rafts can be launched from the site.

The parcel was purchased for \$55,000 with funds from King County to mitigate for the loss of 1.3 acres of WDFW-managed land near Carnation. That property was used by the county to realign a bridge over the Snoqualmie River at Tolt Hill Road. WDFW still owns more than 5 acres at the site, which allows for recreational access.

The state Recreation and Conservation Office, which funded WDFW's acquisition of the original property in late 1960s, requires replacement land for the bridge realignment and a public comment period.



