DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Name of Proposal: INTRODUCTION OF CHINOOK SALMON INTO SELECTED
LOWLAND LAKES

Description of Proposal: The proposed project would stock surplus chinook salmon into the designated lowland lakes within King and Snohomish Counties in accordance with established WDFW protocol.

Location of Proposal, including street, if any: Five lowland lakes in King and Snohomish Counties (see location maps):

2. Twin Lakes/Gissberg Section 29, Township 31 North, Range 05 East WM Snohomish County; Gissberg-Twin Lakes County Park; Twin Lakes Avenue, Northeast of Marysville, Washington.
3. Lake Bosworth Section 36, Township 30 North, Range 06 East WM Snohomish County, East Lake Bosworth Drive, South of Granite Falls, Washington.
4. Angle Lake Section 03, Township 22 North, Range 04 East WM King County; 196th Street and Highway 99; East of Seatac, Washington.
5. Morton Lake Section 07, Township 21 North, Range 06 East WM King County; 195th Avenue and Lake Morton Drive Southeast, Southwest of Kent, Washington.
6. Steel Lake Section 09, Township 21 North, Range 4 East WM King County Steel Lake Park, 308th Street, Northeast of Federal Way, Washington.
7. Rattlesnake Lake Section 34, Township 23 North, Range 08 East WM King County, Cedar Falls Road, South of North Bend, Washington.
8. Lake Wilderness Section 22, Township 26 North, Range 06 East WM King County, Lake Wilderness Park, Lake Wilderness Drive, North of Maple Valley, Washington.
