DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE

Name of Proposal: SKAGIT COUNTY DRAINAGE AND IRRIGATION IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT #22

Description of Proposal: Conduct routine maintenance of drainage infrastructure within the jurisdictional boundary of the Drainage and Irrigation District consistent with the provisions and elements of the attached Drainage Maintenance Agreement and Drainage Maintenance Plan which were developed collaboratively and cooperatively between the duly elected Commissioners of the District and WDFW, and in consultation with the Skagit River System Cooperative. The following types of drainage maintenance activities are considered typical of work necessary to routinely maintain the watercourses that comprise the District's drainage infrastructure.

- ._ Trash Racks - Maintenance/repair, Debris removal and Replacement
- ._ Pump Facilities - Maintenance/repair, Debris removal and Replacement
- ._ Culverts - Maintenance/repair, Debris removal and Replacement
- ._ Flood Gates - Maintenance/repair, Debris removal and Replacement
- ._ Tide Gates - Maintenance/repair, Debris removal and Replacement
- ._ Channel In-water Bucket Mowing - Channel maintenance
- ._ Channel Out-of-Water Mowing - Channel Maintenance
- ._ Dredging - Channel maintenance and Debris removal
- ._ Bridges – Installation, Replacement, Maintenance/repair and Debris removal
