Comments: At Humtuplups Hatchery's Intake Pumping Station, flood waters washed the rip-rap and gravel armoring protection off the intake for the hatchery, exposing the intake piping. Work to be Completed: The applicant will replace the gravel over the intake piping, and then replace the rock rip-rap. Mitigation proposal: To mitigate the slope protection loss over the Humtuplups Hatchery Intake Pump House intake piping, remove approximately .25 (1.5 ft. deep x 16 ft. slope distance x 105 LF) = 23.33 C.Y. of rip rap and save, and install (16 ft. x 105 ft.) / 9 SF / SY = 186.67 SY of filter fabric. Replace the 23.33 C.Y. of rip rap removed for fabric installation. Install 70 C.Y. of rip rap, random, broken machined placed to bring the rock back to pre-disaster. Install an additional .75 ft. x 16 ft. x 105 LF = 46.67 C.Y. of random, broken rip rap to provide added armor the slope. - wlamdbin - 05/30/2009 14:50:17 GMT
