DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE (DNS)

Name of Proposal: ROUND AND LONG LAKES ACCESSES- VAULT TOILET REPLACEMENTS

Description of Proposal:

WDFW will remove THREE existing vault toilets used by public fisherman and replace with THREE new concrete vault toilets manufactured by CXT Concrete Products. The existing toilets are worn and should be replaced before public safety is compromised. The new toilets will be ADA accessible and have a 20'x18' concrete pad placed adjacent to it to allow ADA vehicle parking compliance. The new toilets will be placed in the footprint of the existing toilet layouts fencing perimeter. The fencing and existing toilets will be removed and disposed of offsite.

From Tonasket, Head 12.6 miles east on WA-20. Turn right on Aeneas Valley Rd proceed 4.7 miles to Long Lake entrance on left. Round Lake entrance is 0.25 miles further east on Aeneas Valley Road.

Lead Agency: Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW)

WDFW has determined that this proposal will likely not have a significant adverse impact on the environment. Therefore, state law¹ does not require an environmental impact statement (EIS). WDFW made this determination of nonsignificance (DNS) after we reviewed the environmental checklist and other information on file with us.

We issued this DNS according to state rules.² We will **not act on this proposal for 14 days** from the date we issued the DNS. Agencies, affected tribes, and members of the public are invited to comment on this proposal or DNS. We must receive your comments within 14 days of the date of this letter. This means we must receive your comments by **April 13, 2011**
