Dear Mr. Mraz and Ms. Groven,

Thank you for your comments of the determination on nonsignificance for the Oneida Access Area Renovation project located at 424 Oneida Road in Naselle. I have reviewed your comments and present the following:

SHORELINES & ENVIRONMENTAL ASSISTANCE:

The vegetation that is being installed at the mitigation area is an enhancement to existing vegetation. The area will not be disturbed; the purpose of work in this area is to deter future use of the proposed area, allowing it to return to a more natural state. This 30,000 square feet will be lined with barrier rock and the plantings will take place among the existing vegetation, to reasonably enhance the area. A more detailed planting plan will be determined at the time of the project, as many plants will be "field fit."

TOXICS CLEANUP:

If contamination is suspected, discovered, or occurs during the proposed SEPA action, testing of the potentially contaminated media will be conducted. If contamination of soil or groundwater is readily apparent or is revealed by testing, Ecology will be notified. Washington State Department of Fish & Wildlife (WDFW) shall contact the Environmental Report Tracking System Coordinator at the Southwest Regional Office at (360) 407-6300. For assistance and information about subsequent cleanup and to identify the type of testing that will be required, WDFW shall contact Connie Groven with the Toxic Cleanup Program at the phone number given above.
