Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the determination of nonsignificance for the Lake Arberdeen Pollution Abatement Pond project located east of City of Aberdeen as proposed by Chris Gourley, WA State Department of Fish & Wildlife (WDFW). The Department of Ecology (Ecology) reviewed the environmental checklist and has the following comment(s):

WASTE 2 RESOURCES: Julie Robertson (360) 407-6471

All grading and filling of land must utilize only clean fill, i.e., dirt or gravel. All other materials, including waste concrete and asphalt, are considered to be solid waste and permit approval must be obtained through the local jurisdictional health department prior to filling (WAC 173-350-990).

Please note that demolition debris generated on-site must be disposed of at a permitted facility. The proponent must ensure that debris classified as solid waste is properly disposed of in accordance with state and local solid waste requirements. Questions about proper disposal should be directed to the County Health Department.

Ecology's comments are based upon information provided by the lead agency. As such, they may not constitute an exhaustive list of the various authorizations that must be obtained or legal requirements that must be fulfilled in order to carry out the proposed action.
