SUBSTRATE TYPE: Gravel & hardpan material where gravel is scoured away.

SITE SIZE: **Length-** 200 m (mouth to toe of valley wall)

 Depth- Avg = 2 - 6 cm Max = 25 cm

WATER SOURCE: Valley wall tributary and springs


DIRECTIONS TO SITE: Go north from Forks on Hwy 101 for 8.4 mi. and then turn left onto Lk. Pleasant Rd. (0.4 mi. north of MP 200). Stay on the main road going past the community park and across the Lake Cr. bridge. Turn right and continue up the county road (along the n.w. shore of the lake) to the end of the pavement. This road then becomes the 9000 line. Continue on the 9000 line another 6.0 miles (going past the 9300 & 6000 line junctions) until coming to a new (1990) concrete bridge. Continue 0.2 mi. beyond the bridge to the junction with the 9400. Turn left on the 9400 and continue about 0.9 mi. to the 9410. Keep left at this junction and follow the 9410 truck trail about 3.8 miles to Dinner Plate Cr. (ED-L4-06). At this point the river is 100 to 150 m from the road. Hike out to the river. The mouth of ED-R4-03 is across the river and about 160 m downstream (the first RB trib below the mouth of ED-L4-06).

FISH ACCESS AND CURRENT USE: The egress cuts through a 3 m high cutbank prior to entering the river at a riffle. At lower flows a series of small cascades is exposed in the lower egress. No fish were observed.


FLOODING POTENTIAL: Low.

LANDOWNER: Unknown at this time (probably DNR and/or ITT Rayonier).


COMMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS: ED-R4-03 (Tee Woo Creek) is a small valley wall tributary that appears to be a gravel producer. Some winter rearing may take place in this stream. Recent logging in the upper portion of this reach of ED-R4-03 has left an excessive amount of slash in the channel. More rearing habitat could be available if some of this woody debris were removed. The lower portion of the surveyed reach runs through a mixed stand of alder and conifer.
