Take Highway 530 towards Darrington, and after approximately seventeen miles take Forest Service road # 2010 (right) which is a mile past Boulder River. Drive one mile to French Creek campground and park. Site is located approximately 0.7 miles above the campground on the right bank. See Map.

Area Overview :

Site is a small stream originating out of a forested wetland on a small bench. Site is fed by a series of seeps emanating from the side slope which form a low gradient channel with good rearing potential if it can be accessed through the cascade section near the mouth.






MT BAKER NATIONAL FOREST
