COMMENTS & RECOMMENDATIONS: This channel is very uniform in width and depth. It begins and ends abruptly with no apparent egress. Roads cross the channel in two places with no culverts. Appears to have no habitat potential but should look at it during the winter.

OBSERVER: Young


This observation was made less than one week after the heavy rainfall of early December (more than 10 inches of rain from 12/1 to 12/10 at Forks).

This apparently man-made channel contained only small, isolated pools of water. No egress was found. The channel currently offers no fish habitat. To provide habitat here, a major excavation would be required, similar to Creamer Slough on the Satsop.





