CORRECTIONS

Page 19 – Grays Harbor Wild Coho Release Requirements

Error: The release requirements listed for Grays Harbor Wild Coho are incorrect.

Correction: The section should read: Anglers are required to release wild COHO in numerous Grays Harbor tributaries.

For further information regarding release requirements of COHO in Marine Area 2.2, see page 108 of the 2008-09 Sportfishing Pamphlet.

Page 44 – Cascade River (Skagit Co.) from mouth to Rockport-Cascade Rd. Bridge

Error: The dates for the ALL SPECIES non-buoyant lure restriction and night closure are incorrect.

Correction: The correct dates should read: ALL SPECIES - June 1-July **15** and Sept. 16-Nov. 30: non-buoyant lure restriction and night closure.

Page 59 – Sauk River (Skagit/Snohomish Co.) from Whitechuck River upstream including NORTH FORK and SOUTH FORK

Error: The description of this section of the river is incorrect.

Correction: The description of this section of river should read: Sauk River (Skagit/Snohomish Co.) from Whitechuck River upstream including NORTH FORK and SOUTH FORK to Elliott Creek.

Page 59 – Sauk River (Skagit/Snohomish Co.) SOUTH FORK above Elliott Creek

Error: This section of the Sauk River was omitted from the pamphlet.

Correction: This section of the Sauk River should read: (Dates) June 1-Aug. 31. (Special Rules) ALL SPECIES selective gear rules. All Game Fish: Catch-and-release except up to 2 hatchery STEELHEAD may be retained.

Page 77 – Boulder Creek (Okanogan Co.) and tributaries

Error: Season dates for the fisheries listed were incorrectly stated as Jan. 1-Oct. 31.

Correction: The season dates for the fisheries listed should read: June 1-Oct. 31.

Page 82 – Columbia River from Wells Dam to Chief Joseph Dam

Error: Language in the July 16-Aug. 31 SALMON fishery's additional rules section incorrectly stated that fishing is only open from Wells Dam to Hwy. 173 Bridge at Brewster.

Correction: The second sentence of the additional rules for this fishery should read: Open only to fishing from Wells Dam to Hwy. 17 Bridge at Bridgeport.

Page 91 – Big Tiffany Lake (Okanogan Co.)

Error: The additional rules section for All Other TROUT incorrectly states that anglers may not continue to fish for EASTERN BROOK TROUT (EBT) once 5 TROUT other than EBT have been retained.

Correction: The additional rules for All Other TROUT should read: EASTERN BROOK TROUT (EBT) do not count as part of the TROUT daily limit.

Page 99 – Sullivan Lake (Pend Oreille Co.)

Error: The daily limit of 10 listed for TROUT is incorrect.

Correction: The daily limit for TROUT should read: 2.

A Message from the Director and Commission Chair

Spring is always a hopeful time for anglers. Fisheries start opening left and right: spring Chinook on the Columbia River, halibut in Puget Sound, jumbo trout in lakes around the state.

This year's spring Chinook fishery looks especially promising. An estimated 269,300 upriver "springers" are expected to return to the Columbia River, which would be the third-largest run since 1977. Returns of fall Chinook also look strong.

Still, it's impossible to ignore the dire predictions this year for many salmon stocks ranging from British Columbia to the Mexican border.

Sockeye returns to Canada's Fraser River tanked last year, and are not expected to recover anytime soon. The story is much the same on California's Sacramento River, where last year's return of fall Chinook jacks was less than 6 percent of the long-term average, and for Oregon's coastal Chinook, which are failing to meet escapement goals for the first time.

Here in our own state, coho returns to the Columbia River are the main concern this year. The pre-season forecast for coho returning to the Columbia River and its tributaries is just 196,700 fish, down from 462,000 in 2007. As many as a million fish return in a good year.

That forecast will have a significant effect on fishing seasons, both on the Columbia River and along the Pacific coast, where spring Chinook fisheries have been canceled for the first time in decades.

So what's going on here? Weren't we supposed to be in a period of favorable ocean conditions for salmon now?

The answer is yes: We should still be seeing the effects of cold-water ocean conditions that appeared in 1999 and helped produce strong returns to the Columbia and other West Coast rivers through 2004. That trend, the result of a phenomenon known as the decadal oscillation, has historically lasted 20 to 30 years before shifting back to less-favorable warm-water conditions.

But scientists across the West Coast agree that something strange happened in 2003. Suddenly, years ahead of schedule, ocean temperatures increased, reducing the amount of food available for juvenile salmon. The good news is that ocean conditions appear to have now shifted back to cold-water conditions, but too late for many stocks returning this year.

Add to this the weather-related poor freshwater conditions for juvenile salmon in 2006 and 2007 along Washington's coast and throughout Puget Sound.

All of this has made the job of forecasting salmon returns more difficult.

Can we expect ocean conditions to be favorable for the next decade, or should we plan for another downturn? Was the recent odd swing in ocean temperatures an indication of global warming or just a "hiccup," as some have called it, in historical patterns. Do the computer models we use to estimate fishing mortality based upon historical fishing patterns still work, or do we

have to take a different approach?

Without clear answers to these questions, the only prudent course was to emphasize conservation in setting salmon-fishing seasons this year. While we were able to offer some great fishing opportunities this year, some changes were necessary to protect weak stocks. A prime example is the spring Chinook season on the Columbia River, where we had to move the bulk of the fishery upriver from Portland to protect a weak Chinook run predicted for the Willamette River.

Of course, salmon are not the only species of concern. Just last year, Puget Sound steelhead were listed for protection under the federal Endangered Species Act (ESA), smelt haven't returned to the Cowlitz River in decent numbers since 2003 and five species of Puget Sound rockfish were petitioned to be listed under the federal ESA.

Anglers play an important role in the future of all of these fisheries. This year, as always, we ask that you observe the regulations for all species, especially those requiring the release of wild, unmarked salmon. Careful handling and prompt release of these fish enhance their survival.

Without selective fishing rules, many of the fisheries that anglers count on and participate in from year to year simply would not exist. Please help us keep these fisheries open by following the rules outlined in this pamphlet. Have a great year and enjoy fishing in Washington's waters.

A Message from the Assistant Director and the Deputy Assistant Director

Fishing Friends,

The message for this year of fishing and shellfishing is "Conservation is the key". The key to what, you might ask? Conservation is the key to protecting our wild fish populations now and into the future which will, in turn, enable us to continue to enjoy fishing in our beautiful state for many years' to come. We are so fortunate in Washington to have the many fish and shellfish resources that we do.

However, we are also a state where both the human population and the conversion of our "wild places" into housing and industry is growing at a rapid pace. This unprecedented growth is putting an immense strain on the estuaries, rivers, streams and lakes that provide the critical rearing habitat for our many wild fish species. In addition to that, we are just beginning to understand the changes that are occurring in our climate as a result of global warming; this issue has the potential to dramatically affect the natural systems and resources across the world, nation, and our state.

In Washington, there are ESA (Endangered Species Act) listed fish species throughout the state: Puget Sound, Washington Coast, Lower Columbia River, Upper Columbia River, Snake River, and Northeast Washington. These issues have made the management of our fish species extremely complicated. It is an ever-increasing challenge to be able to offer the fishing opportunities across the state while at the same time protecting our wild fish populations; both those that are currently healthy and those that are listed under the ESA. Staff works with our tribal co-managers and federal agencies to develop fishery management plans that serve to protect and conserve wild fish populations while providing fishing opportunity.

One tool we have used to maintain recreational fishing is what we call "marked selective fishing". This tool allows us to direct fishing on hatchery fish only, even

when they are returning to our river systems mixed together with wild fish. We are able to do this by removing the small fin (called the adipose fin) just in back of the dorsal fin on anadromous fish such as salmon and steelhead. Removing that fin while the young fish are still in the hatchery results in returning adults having a clearly visible external mark (missing fin) that signifies they are a hatchery fish. Fishers are then able to keep those fish with this missing adipose fin and release, unharmed, those fish which have the adipose fin intact, signifying they are a wild fish. This is one very effective way to protect our wild fish and help the various stocks of fish to recover while continuing to provide fishing opportunity.

As the fishing public, you help us manage our resources by working with us to develop fishing regulations that promote good stewardship while providing meaningful fishing opportunity. Your input is important to us and can be provided through a variety of means such as regional public meetings, through participation in the North of Falcon process, by you providing input at the Commission meetings, and through the process of submitting regulation proposals during what is called the major rule cycle, which occurs every other year on even numbered years and is the time when we solicit recommendations from the public.

One example of this kind of cooperation is the management of Puget Sound Dungeness crab. This continues to be a very popular fishery throughout the summer and late fall months of each year. In order to provide maximum fishing opportunity to the various user groups (commercial tribal and recreational fishers), these groups have helped in the development of a catch reporting system which allows for timely reporting of recreational catch by marine area through both the internet and by mail. This improved catch reporting system helps us monitor and manage the

various fisheries in a timely and more accurate manner, thus benefiting all of the various user groups. Regarding recreational Dungeness crab fishing in Puget Sound, every crab fisher plays a vital role in ensuring that these fishing opportunities continue into the future. You can help by getting all the catch information reported in a timely manner and consistent with the information provided on the Crab Catch Record Card. Also, and this is critically important, please remember to also report when and where you went crab fishing and did not catch any crab.

As we drove along the Columbia River the other day, we were able to observe one of Washington's most popular recreational fisheries in progress, that is, the Columbia River Spring Chinook fishery. It was a beautiful, sunny day and there were a good number of fishers out on the water trying to catch one of those highly prized Spring Chinook. From the early numbers that we have as of this date, this fishery appears to be have been very successful thus far and will continue to be throughout this year's season.

This fishery is but one of the many great fishing opportunities in Washington. We recommend you take advantage of those that will occur in the coming year: opportunities abound to get outdoors and go fishing for trout, salmon, steelhead, bass, crab, razor clams, shrimp, just to name a few. Whether you fish from shore, a boat, a pier, a bridge, in a lake, a stream, a river, in Puget Sound, or in the Ocean; Washington offers many ways to experience the joy of fishing. There is a bumper sticker that seems to sum it all up in the minds of our fishing public and that is: Eat, Sleep and Go Fishing...

Our natural resources are the treasure of this great state and we hope that you enjoy them often. Working together we can protect and conserve them for many generations of fishers to come.

Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife & Northwest Tribal Treaty Fishing Rights

There are 29 federally-recognized tribes in Washington, 21 of which have off-reservation hunting and fishing rights secured by federal law. Three additional tribes outside of Washington also have off-reservation treaty rights within Washington. Washington tribes also have hunting and fishing rights within their reservations.



The State of Washington and Indian tribes both manage activities with respect to many of the same resources including salmon, steelhead, shellfish, marine fish, and wildlife species. The long-term health of these resources depends on the state and the tribes working cooperatively to identify objectives and manage our respective activities to meet common goals.

The government-to-government relationship between WDFW and tribes is established through federal law, the Washington Centennial Accord and a history of cooperation in developing joint management agreements related to fish and wildlife. Notable examples of court decisions that provide the legal foundation for the cooperative management relationship between WDFW and the Indian tribes include U.S. v. Washington, U.S. v. Oregon, Hoh v. Baldrige, and Settler v. Lameer. Some of these rulings may be viewed online at: <http://www.ccrh.org/comm/river/table.htm>.

The state and the tribes each have a set of responsibilities and rights that must be respected. WDFW has the responsibility for protecting, preserving, and perpetuating fish and wildlife within the boundaries of the state. It has authority to carry out that responsibility by regulating fishing and hunting. This responsibility must be exercised consistent with federal law, including treaties reserving tribal fishing and hunting rights. Tribes have the authority to regulate their members' exercise of federally secured rights, including the treaty right of taking fish at usual and accustomed fishing places. Tribal authority is exercised in conformity with provisions of the applicable federal law.



WDFW and the tribes consult through a variety of co-management forums to resolve issues and jointly develop more than 50 management agreements for fish, shellfish and wildlife.

State-tribal agreements include conservation objectives, catch accounting procedures, data sharing requirements, enforcement needs, and a commitment to meet each other's resource management objectives. WDFW also collaborates with tribes in intergovernmental forums on salmon recovery planning, forest practices rules, environmental permitting, and addressing the impacts of hydroelectric projects.

WDFW is committed to working with tribes to meet our shared conservation and management objectives to secure the long-term health of the fish and wildlife of the state.

New Public Conduct Rules Now in Effect on WDFW Lands

The Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission adopted new rules (Washington Administrative Code 232-13) in December after years of discussion and extensive public review. As the number of users and types of use continue to increase on WDFW lands, the new rules provide a fair and sensible approach to protecting both fish and wildlife habitats and recreational values consistent with healthy wildlife populations.

These rules, which only apply on WDFW lands, are now in effect. The complete public conduct rule package is available on WDFW's website at <http://wdfw.wa.gov/lands/wac232/>. Although some conduct rules remain in place and have not changed, the new WAC chapter compiles them in one location for easy reference.

The rules address behavior and conduct, parking, camping, campfires, dumping and littering, target shooting, fireworks, pets, building blinds and tree stands, access, commercial and noncommercial use, and enforcement.

Fire rules allow campfires up to a maximum of three feet in diameter and three feet high. The new rules also include a 21-day camping limit within a 30-day period. Vehicles should not be left unattended for more than 21 days. Unattended blinds are available to the public on a "first-come-first-serve" basis. These rules were designed to provide an equal opportunity for all users.

The firearms and target practicing rule prohibits the use of glass, signs, appliances, mattresses, televisions, furniture and exploding items as targets. With the exception of clay pigeons, debris from target practice should be removed. These rules, along with no-littering laws, address a growing concern for the amount of garbage left on public lands. The rules also prohibit the discharge of firearms within 500 feet of one of the 21 Department-designated campgrounds. These very limited shooting restrictions were included to protect the recreating public.

Rules governing pets allow hunters to use hunting dogs under their control, but not to let them or other pets roam unattended. From April through July, all dogs and other pets must be leashed on WDFW lands to protect nesting wildlife.

To manage multiple user groups, a permit from the Department is now required for any private or public event involving more than thirty people.

A commercial use permit from the Department is required for any activity on Department lands where a fee is charged or where the purpose is the sale or barter of a good or service regardless of whether the activity is intended to produce a profit. A Washington State fishing guide license qualifies as a permit to use WDFW water access sites. Hunting guides using WDFW lands are required to obtain a permit through one of WDFW's six regional offices. Permits will be issued on a limited basis to manage the number of hunters. Permit distribution may be used to address equity of hunter access and concerns for local wildlife populations.

All those that use WDFW lands are encouraged to take a look at the new rules. The Department will be posting signs throughout the spring and spreading the word about the new rules at meetings and events. The Department will also be phasing in enforcement of the new rules throughout 2008, generally issuing warnings rather than citations except in the case of egregious violations.

With the new public conduct rules in place, WDFW public lands will continue to provide safe, beautiful wildlands for all users to enjoy now and in the future.

STATEWIDE RULE CHANGES

Bass - Daily limits have been separated for largemouth and smallmouth bass. The largemouth daily limit is now: No minimum size. Only bass less than 12" may be retained, except one over 17" may be retained. Daily limit 5. The smallmouth daily limit is now: No minimum size. Only one over 14" may be retained. Daily limit 10. Both species may still be caught, retained, and released from a livewell until a daily limit is in possession.

Tiger Muskie - The minimum size for tiger muskie has been changed to 50", and they may no longer be retained in tournaments.

Sturgeon Measurement - Beginning on January 1, 2009, a new way of measuring the length of sturgeon may take effect. This start date allows us to coordinate our rules on the Columbia River with Oregon, and implementation of the rule is dependant on Oregon adopting the same change. Rather than total length, sturgeon minimum and maximum sizes will be expressed in fork length measurements. Fork length is defined as the distance from the tip of the nose to the middle of the fork in the tail. Check the Sportfishing Hotline or Department website in late December for news on this possible rule change.

Yearly Limit for Hatchery Steelhead (Subsequent Catch Record Cards) - The 30-fish annual limit for hatchery steelhead has been dropped. The one-fish annual limit for wild steelhead remains. This means that anglers may purchase additional catch record cards for hatchery steelhead. However, if they intend to harvest a wild fish, ANGLERS WISHING TO HARVEST THEIR ONE WILD FISH MUST RETAIN THE WILD FISH ON THEIR FIRST CATCH RECORD CARD, as subsequent cards are only valid for hatchery steelhead. All cards must be turned in by April 30, or earlier.

GAME FISH

Goodman Creek Wild Steelhead - Anglers are no longer allowed to keep wild steelhead in Goodman Creek.

SHELLFISH

Clam and Oyster Beach Health Closures - The Department of Health has maintained health advisories on many beaches that are permanently polluted, usually due to sewage outfalls. These beaches have now been closed by WDFW as well, to cut down on the confusion of beaches that are tacitly "open" by one agency and closed by the other. The list of beaches affected can be found on page 131 in the shellfish section.

Puget Sound Spot Shrimp Pot Mesh Rule Change Starting June 1 - In any area of Puget Sound open for spot shrimp after 12:01 a.m. June 1, the minimum mesh size will now be 1" (see page 141), similar to the current rule for the month of May, with no minimum carapace size for the spot shrimp retained. In any area closed for spot shrimp after 12:01 a.m. June 1, but open for coonstripe and pink shrimp, ½" mesh will be allowed.

SALMON

Single Point Hooks Required in Marine Areas - Single-point hooks have been required in Marine Areas 1-4 for a number of years. They are now required when angling for salmon in Marine Areas 5-13 as well.

Area 5 and 6 Chinook Selective Fishery - This popular fishery will be managed with a July 1 through August 9 season instead of a quota in 2008. This will provide anglers with more flexibility in planning a fishing vacation this year.

Hood Canal Coho Conservation - Bag limits in Marine Area 12 have been reduced to include no more than 2 coho salmon due to conservation concerns for Hood Canal coho.

Area 9 Mark Selective Coho Fishery - Due to conservation concerns for Hood Canal coho, anglers will be required to release wild coho from July 16 through September 15 in Marine Area 9.

Chehalis River Bank Angling Opportunity - Additional opportunities for bank anglers at Morrison Park along the lower Chehalis River in Aberdeen. The park area will open concurrent with Marine Area 2.2 regulations.

Grays Harbor Wild Coho Release Requirements - Anglers are required to release wild coho in Marine Area 2.2 and numerous Grays Harbor tributaries.

Queets River Basin Chinook Release Requirements - Anglers are required to release Chinook salmon in the Queets, Clearwater, and Salmon rivers September 1 through November 30.

Puyallup River Opener - An agreement between WDFW and the Puyallup Tribe opens the Puyallup River August 16, 2 weeks earlier than last year.

Samish River Gear Rules - Stationary Gear Rule is in effect August 1 through December 31 on the Samish River. The line, weight, lure, or bait must be moving (not stationary) while in the water.

Skagit and Cascade Rivers Spring Chinook Season Extended - Spring Chinook season will be open from June 1 through July 15 in 2008. Anglers will also be allowed to keep 4 hatchery Chinook, of which 2 may be adult Chinook.

Skokomish River Chinook Season - Chinook season will only be open from August 1 through September 5 due to limited numbers of Chinook returning this year. All fishing will be closed in the lower river from September 6 through 30.

Area 5 Late Season "Hooknose" Coho Opportunity - Again this year wild Coho may be retained from September 16 through 30.

Lewis River Mouth Fall Chinook Sanctuary - An 8 mile stretch of the Columbia River near the mouth of the Lewis River (from the south end of Martin Island to the south end of Bachelor Island) will be closed to fall Chinook retention, and there will be only 16 days of fall Chinook retention between the Rocky Point/Tongue Point Line and Bonneville Dam, to protect depressed Lewis River fall Chinook.

Buoy 10 Chinook Salmon - Anglers may retain Chinook salmon from August 1 through September 1, or 32 days in 2008, compared to only 13 days in 2007.

This pamphlet is a summary of WDFW regulations. Before fishing in a National Park or on an Indian reservation, contact the Park or Tribe to check their regulations (see page 15 for contact information).

NOTE: Emergency rules may occur throughout the year and will supersede the rules contained in this pamphlet. License Suspensions and Property Forfeitures

Washington State's Fish and Wildlife Enforcement Code (Revised Code of Washington Chapter 77.15) requires the **mandatory** suspension of a person's fishing privileges, for up to five years, if a person is convicted of one of the following violations:

- assaulting a Fish and Wildlife Enforcement Officer, or an employee or agent of the Department performing official duties
- first degree waste of fish and wildlife
- harvesting endangered fish or wildlife
- unlawfully purchasing or using a license

In addition, repeat offenders - any person with three convictions for any kind of violation within ten years - receive a mandatory two-year suspension of all fishing and hunting privileges. The law treats an uncontested notice of infraction, a bail forfeiture (payment of the fine on a citation), or a guilty plea as a conviction that will be counted. You will permanently lose your fishing and hunting privileges if you hunt or fish on a suspended license or demonstrate a willful or wanton disregard for the conservation of fish or wildlife. Furthermore, property that is used to violate any fishing and hunting regulations, or that is held with the intention of committing a violation, may be seized for evidence and may ultimately be forfeited to the state.

Heightened Security

After the events of September 11, 2001, security has been heightened around the nation. Please be aware that there are 500-yard Naval Vessel Protective Zones around all naval vessels. Also, most military installations on the water have exclusionary zones around them. Consult <http://www.navcen.uscg.gov> or the local base commander or Coast Guard office for more details.

Fish Tagging

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife has released millions of Chinook and coho salmon with microscopic coded-wire tags implanted in their heads. The majority of coded-wire tags are implanted in hatchery fish at the juvenile stage, before release from the hatchery. These fish are eventually caught in fisheries, sampled on spawning grounds or used for broodstock when they return to the hatchery. WDFW samplers use electronic wands to detect the coded-wire tags, which provide fishery managers and biologists with information about fishery distribution, survival and composition of spawning ground population.

Several state and federal agencies (including WDFW), universities and Indian tribes also have released salmon, steelhead and sea-run cutthroat trout with small acoustic tags in their body cavities. These tags transmit signals that are picked up by special receivers, allowing fishery managers to track the fish. Anglers who find a tag while cleaning their catch should call (360) 902-2700 to report the tag number, species of fish, date and location of their catch.



Boat Safely and Live to Fish Again

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife supports and encourages safe boating, and urges anglers to be careful and responsible on Washington's waterways. Recreational fishing accounts for about half of this state's boating fatalities. WDFW reminds anglers to always wear U.S. Coast Guard approved lifejackets, understand and be alert for weather and tide changes, carry all required safety equipment, and never "push your luck" when it comes to safety on the water. If you have never taken a boating safety course, contact the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary, U.S. Power Squadrons, or Washington State Parks Boating Program, for information on mandatory education classes and home-study courses. Derelict Fishing Gear

The Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife is collecting information, statewide, on the locations of derelict fishing gear, such as gillnets and crab pots. To report the location of derelict gear, call (800) 477-6224 or visit <http://wdfw.wa.gov/fish/derelict>. Qualified organizations will remove derelict gear based on information collected.

Prohibited Aquatic Species

It is illegal to transport, introduce, or use prohibited aquatic animal and plant species in the state. WDFW encourages citizens to be vigilant in preventing the introduction or spread of prohibited and other non-native species. LICENSES VALID FROM APRIL 1, 2008-MARCH 31, 2009.

1 • • • Fishing License Requirements:

- Everyone 15 years of age or older **must** have a license.
- Federal and state law requires persons 15 years or older to give their Social Security Number in order to obtain a license (*Federal Law US Code: Title 42, Section 666, Paragraph 13, Section A. State Law RCW 77.32.014*).
- Licenses must be on your person while fishing.

2 • • • Fishing Licenses are not required for:

- Common carp, crawfish, bullfrogs, smelt or unclassified marine invertebrates (see seasons and limits).

- Free Fishing Weekend (Catch Record Card may be required, see below).

3 • • • Catch Record Cards (see page 26) must be in your possession and are required for everyone (resident, non-resident, youth) fishing for:

- Salmon
- Steelhead
- Puget Sound Dungeness Crab
- Sturgeon
- Halibut

License Types

Combination License:* The combination license allows the license holder to fish in freshwater and saltwater, and to harvest shellfish/seaweed (see catch record card requirements, page 26).

Freshwater License:* The freshwater license allows the license holder to fish in freshwater areas (see catch record card requirements, page 26).

Saltwater License:* The saltwater license allows the license holder to fish in saltwater (see catch record card requirements, page 26).

Shellfish/Seaweed License: The shellfish/seaweed license allows the license holder to harvest Dungeness and red rock crab, goose barnacles, mussels, octopus, oysters, razor clams, scallops, sea cucumbers, sea urchins, shrimp, softshell and hardshell clams, squid, and seaweed (see catch record card requirements, page 26).

1-5 day (combination) Licenses: These short-term licenses allow the license holder to fish 1-5 consecutive days for any species in freshwater and saltwater and to harvest shellfish/seaweed. Except for active resident military personnel, this license is not valid for game fish for the 8-day period beginning the last Saturday in April (see catch record card requirements, page 26).

Razor Clam License: Available as an annual license or a 3-day (consecutive) license, this allows the holder to harvest only razor clams. No catch record card is required.

Puget Sound Dungeness Crab Endorsement: There is a \$2.50 endorsement fee for annual licenses, and a \$.50 endorsement fee for 1-5 day licenses to fish for Dungeness Crab in Puget Sound. (There is no fee for juvenile anglers, however the endorsement is still required). Separate catch record cards will be issued for Puget Sound Dungeness Crab with separate reporting instructions (see page 26).

*There are three areas where anglers may legally fish with either a freshwater, saltwater, or combination license. These are Grays Harbor (Marine Area 2-2), Willapa Bay (Marine Area 2-1), and the Columbia River between a line from Rocky Point on the Washington shore to Tongue Point on the Oregon shore and the Buoy 10 line.

License Qualifications for Persons with Disabilities

Reduced-fee licenses may be provided to persons who submit an application with proper documentation as:

- Resident veterans with a service-connected disability of 30% or more.
- Resident veterans 65 years of age or older with a service-connected disability
- Resident persons who permanently use a wheelchair
- Resident who is blind or visually impaired
- Resident with a developmental disability



These and other permanent disabilities may be qualifiers for a Designated Harvester Card, which allows another licensed person to assist an angler with a disability in harvesting a daily limit of fish or shellfish.

Applications for reduced fees or a Designated Harvester Card must be processed through a Department of Fish and Wildlife office.

Fishing Contests

Adult - An adult fishing contest exists when six or more licensed anglers (15 years old and above) fish competitively for game fish (i.e., trout, bass, walleye, etc.) and determine winners, regardless of the prize value. A permit is required.

Juvenile - A juvenile fishing event is restricted to anglers 14 years old and under. A juvenile fishing event exists when 10 or more juveniles fish competitively for game fish (i.e., trout, bass, walleye, etc.) and determine winners, regardless of the prize value. Approval to conduct a juvenile fishing event must be obtained from the WDFW regional office in the region in which the event will occur.

Adult fishing contests or juvenile fishing events that target food fish (i.e., salmon, sturgeon, halibut, etc.) do not need a permit and do not need to notify the agency.

For more information, or to request an application for a permit to conduct a fishing contest, contact the WDFW Fish Program at (360) 902-2700. There is a \$24 application fee.

Free Fishing Weekend

June 7-8, 2008, is "Free Fishing Weekend" in Washington. On those two days, fishing licenses are not required. Catch Record Cards are required to fish for salmon, sturgeon, steelhead, Puget Sound Dungeness crab, and halibut. Free fishing days are valid for everyone. All other rules apply, including area and lure or bait restrictions and size and catch limits. A Vehicle Use Permit is not required. **Each year, the Free Fishing Weekend will be the first weekend in June, after the first Monday in June.**

Washington State Fishing Guide Licenses

Commercial use of WDFW land requires a permit. A Washington State fishing guide license qualifies as a permit to use WDFW water access sites. For more information about rules governing conduct on WDFW land see WAC 232-13 or contact the Wildlife Program at (360) 902-2515.

Vehicle Use Permit

Vehicle use permits are required to park vehicles at all posted WDFW wildlife areas and water access sites. Vehicle use permits are valid from April 1, 2008 to March 31, 2009. These permits generate funding for maintenance of WDFW lands and water access sites used by hunters, anglers, boaters, bird watchers, and other recreationalists. Vehicle use permits are issued once per year with the purchase of an annual fishing license (excluding shellfish/seaweed and razor clam licenses) at no additional charge, or may be purchased separately for \$10.95. Permits are transferable between two vehicles. Additional permits may be purchased for \$5.48 each. Permits must be clearly displayed and visible from outside the vehicle. They can be placed on the dash or hung from the rear-view mirror. Rear-view mirror hangers are available through your local license dealer or they may be obtained at <http://fishhunt.dfw.wa.gov>.

The Catch Record Card is an important management tool for estimating the recreational catch of sturgeon, steelhead, salmon, halibut, and Puget Sound Dungeness crab. A catch record card must be in your possession to fish for these species. **Washington Administrative Code (WAC 220-56-175, WAC 220-69-236)** requires all kept sturgeon, steelhead, salmon, halibut, and Puget Sound Dungeness Crab to be recorded on your Catch Record Card, and requires all anglers to return their Catch Record Card by April 30, or for Dungeness crab by the date indicated on the card, **even if nothing is caught or you did not fish**. 

When you purchase a Puget Sound Dungeness crab endorsement you will be issued a **summer** and **winter** Catch Record Card. All Puget Sound Dungeness crab kept are required to be recorded on your Catch Record Card immediately after capture and before fishing again. Record catch information **in ink**. Be sure to make a check mark for each crab kept. The check mark is used by field enforcement officers to ensure each crab kept is immediately recorded. At the end of the fishing trip, or prior to moving to a new marine area, enter the total number of check marks in the **CRAB KEPT PER DAY** column. The number should equal the number of checkmarks on that line.

Dungeness crab catch cards need to be returned to the department or reported on the internet (www.fishhunt.dfw.wa.gov) by the dates printed on the cards.

Definitions of Terms used throughout the Pamphlet

ADULT SALMON

In freshwater and Marine Areas 2-1 and 2-2, Chinook 24" or more in length; coho 20" or more in length; and pink, chum, and sockeye salmon 12" or more in length, are adults.

ANGLING (HOOK & LINE FISHING)

Fishing for personal use (not for sale or barter) with a line attached to a pole capable of being held in hand while landing fish, or a hand-operated line without a rod or reel.

ANNUAL LIMIT

The number of fish that may be taken, statewide, during the license year (April 1-March 31).

BAIT

Anything that attracts fish or shellfish by scent and/or flavor. This includes any device made of feathers, hair, fiber, wood, metal, glass, cork, leather, rubber, or plastic, which uses scent and/or flavoring to attract fish or wildlife.

BASS

When used in the fishing pamphlet, the term "bass" includes largemouth and smallmouth bass.

BOTTOMFISH

Includes Pacific cod, Pacific tomcod, Pacific hake (or whiting), walleye pollock, all species of dabs, sole and flounders (except Pacific halibut), lingcod, ratfish, sablefish, cabezon, greenling, buffalo sculpin, great sculpin, red Irish lord, brown Irish lord, Pacific staghorn sculpin, wolfeel, giant wrymouth, plainfin midshipman, all species of shark, skate, rockfish, rattail, and surf perches excluding shiner perch.

BOW-AND-ARROW FISHING

Taking fish with a line attached to an arrow and propelled by a bow. **NOTE:** Crossbows are illegal.

CATCH-AND-RELEASE FISHING

A type of fishing where all of the fish caught are immediately released back into the water.

CHUMMING

Scattering feed or other materials to attract fish to a location.

CLOSED WATERS

A body of water where fishing is prohibited.

DAILY LIMIT

The maximum number or pounds of fish, shellfish, or seaweed of a given species and size which a person may legally keep in a single day.

DESIGNATED HARVESTER CARD

A Designated Harvester Card allows the licensed person with a disability to receive assistance from another licensed individual for fishing or harvesting shellfish. The designated harvester must have their license and the Designated Harvested Card in their possession when assisting a person with a disability.

EMERGENCY RULE (RCW 34.05.350)

An emergency rule is filed by an agency when an agency determines that immediate action is necessary. An emergency rule takes effect upon filing with the Code Revisor unless a later date is specified.

EQUIPPED WITH A MOTOR

A motor is attached to the floating device, regardless of whether the motor is in the water.

FATHOM LINE (20 OR 30)

It is unlawful to fish for or possess bottomfish or lingcod seaward of a line approximating 20 or 30 fathoms when fathom restrictions are in place. Halibut fishery may be restricted to the waters shoreward of 30 fathoms in Marine Areas 3 and 4.

FLY

A lure on which thread, feathers, hackle, or yarn cover a minimum of half of the shank of the hook. Metallic colored tape, tinsel, mylar, or bead eyes may be used as an integral part of the design of the fly pattern.

FLY FISHING ONLY

In "Fly Fishing Only" waters, an angler may use only the following tackle: up to 2 flies, each with a barbless single-point hook, not to exceed 1/2" from point to shank, and a conventional fly line (other line may be used for backing or leader if attached to at least 25 feet of fly line). Anglers may not use fixed spool reels, bait, or weight attached to the leader or line. Only knotless nets may be used to land fish.

An angler with a disability, who has been issued a special use disability permit and has it in their possession, may fish in "Fly Fishing Only" waters with spin casting gear, with a casting bubble, and may use an electric motor while fishing on "Fly Fishing Only" lakes where fishing from a boat is allowed. All other restrictions listed above still apply.

FOOD FISH

Includes forage fish, halibut, bottomfish, common carp, shad, tuna, mackerel, salmon, and sturgeon.

FORAGE FISH

Includes anchovy, sand lance, herring, sardine, and smelt.

FORAGE FISH DIP NET

A section of netting (maximum mesh size is 3/8" stretched mesh) distended by a rigid frame not exceeding 36" across and directly attached to a rigid handle. May only be used for forage fish or squid.

FORAGE FISH JIG GEAR

Jig gear may have up to three treble hooks or nine single-point hooks, not to exceed 3/8" between point and shank. May only be used for forage fish or squid.

FROZEN

Fish or shellfish that are hard frozen throughout.

FRESH

Fish or shellfish that are refrigerated, iced, salted, or surface glazed.

FRESHWATER AREA

Those waters within any freshwater river, lake, stream, or pond. On the bank or within 10 yards of any freshwater river, lake, stream, or pond. On or within any boat launch, ramp, or parking facility associated with any freshwater river, lake, stream, or pond.

GAFFING

Attempting to take fish by impaling fish with a hook attached directly to a pole or other device.

GAME FISH

Includes bass, burbot (freshwater ling), catfish, crappie, grayling, northern pikeminnow, peamouth chub, yellow perch, northern pike, tiger musky, sucker, sunfish, grass carp, trout (including steelhead, kokanee, and Dolly Varden/bull trout), landlocked salmon (Chinook, coho or Atlantic), walleye, and whitefish.

STATEWIDE GENERAL RULES

Rules that apply to all fishing statewide.

HANDLING RULES

FRESHWATER: It is unlawful to totally remove salmon, steelhead, or Dolly Varden/Bull trout from the water if it is unlawful to retain those fish, or if the angler subsequently releases the salmon, steelhead, or Dolly Varden/bull trout.

MARINE AREA 2-2: It is unlawful to totally remove salmon from the water if it is illegal to retain those fish, except anglers fishing from boats 30 feet or longer as listed on either their state or Coast Guard registration are exempt.


Definitions of Terms used throughout the Pamphlet

HANDLING RULES (CONT.)

MARINE AREAS 5-13: It is unlawful to bring wild salmon or a species of salmon aboard a vessel if it is unlawful to retain that salmon ("aboard" means inside the gunwale of a vessel).

HATCHERY SALMON

Means a Chinook or coho with a clipped adipose fin and having a healed scar at the location of the fin.



HATCHERY STEELHEAD OR TROUT

Means a steelhead or cutthroat with a clipped adipose or ventral fin and a healed scar at the location of the clipped fin.

HEAD OF A FISH

Any portion forward of the rear margin of the gill plate.

HOOK

A hook may be single-point, double, or treble. See Freshwater or Marine Area gear rules for limitations.

BARBLESS

A hook from which all barbs have been deleted when manufactured, filed off, or pinched down.

SINGLE-POINT


A hook with only one point.

DOUBLE

A hook with two points on a common shank.

TREBLE

A hook with three points on a common shank.



IN A WILD STATE

Population of animals referred to as naturally reproducing within the state.

IN THE FIELD OR IN TRANSIT

Anywhere other than at an ordinary residence. Dockside fish cleaning facilities, boat ramps, and cold storage lockers are considered in the field.

INTERNAL COMBUSTION MOTORS PROHIBITED

Means fishing from a floating device equipped with an internal combustion motor is not allowed.

JACK SALMON

Chinook and coho salmon that return at a younger age than most members of their species. For freshwater and in Willapa Bay (area 2-1) and Grays Harbor (area 2-2), a jack salmon is a Chinook less than 24" in length or a coho less than 20" in length.

JUVENILE ONLY

Waters open for fishing only to youth under 15 years of age.

KOKANEES

Freshwater resident sockeye salmon. Where the sea-run (sockeye) and the resident (kokanee) forms occur together, refer to the Special Rules for the size differences between kokanee and sockeye.

LANDLOCKED SALMON RULES


In waters where landlocked salmon rules apply, salmon are regulated as trout. Seasons, daily limits, and size restriction rules for landlocked salmon are identical to the rules for trout in the same water. The angler's combined catch of salmon and trout applies toward the trout limit. A Catch Record Card is not required to retain salmon in these waters.

LICENSE YEAR

April 1, 2008-March 31, 2009, both dates inclusive.


LENGTH

The shortest distance between the tip of the nose and the extreme tip of the tail, measured while the fish is laying on its side on a flat surface with its tail in a normal position.



LENGTH, FORK

Fork length is defined as the distance from the tip of the nose to the fork in the tail.



LURE

A manufactured article, complete with hooks, constructed of feathers, hair, fiber, wood, metal, glass, cork, leather, rubber, or plastic, which does not use scent and/or flavoring to attract fish.

MARINE AREA

Those waters contained within the boundaries of Washington state, within Puget Sound, Hood Canal, the Strait of Juan de Fuca, the San Juan Islands, the Strait of Georgia, and the Pacific Ocean, including estuaries seaward of the river or stream mouth (see Mouth definition).

MAXIMUM SIZE (MAX. SIZE)

The largest size of fish or shellfish that may be kept. For fish, the maximum size refers to the length.

MINIMUM SIZE (MIN. SIZE)

The smallest size of fish or shellfish that may be kept. For fish, the minimum size refers to the length.

MOTORS PROHIBITED

Fishing from a floating device equipped with a motor is not allowed.

MOUTH


Unless otherwise defined, the mouth of a stream, river, or slough is a line projected between the outermost uplands at the mouth. Outermost uplands are those lands not covered by water during ordinary high water.

NIGHT CLOSURE

When a night closure is in effect, fishing is closed from one hour after official sunset to one hour before official sunrise.

NON-BUOYANT LURE RESTRICTIONS

When a non-buoyant lure restriction is in effect, anglers fishing with a non-buoyant lure (one that sinks in freshwater) may only use a lure that is equipped with one single-point hook measuring $\frac{3}{4}$ " or less from point to shank.



When using a buoyant lure (one that floats in freshwater) in an area with a non-buoyant lure restriction, hooks must be attached to, or below, but within 3" of the floating lure. (No hook may be tied above the lure.) Weights may not be attached below or less than 12" above a buoyant lure. The single-point hook restriction does not apply to a buoyant lure.

Definitions of Terms used throughout the Pamphlet

ORDINARY RESIDENCE

A residential dwelling where a person normally lives, with associated features such as address, telephone number, utility account, etc. A motorhome or camper parked at a campsite is not considered to be an ordinary residence.

POSSESSION LIMIT

The number of daily limits allowed to be kept in the field or in transit.

PROCESSED

Fish or shellfish that have been subjected to heat (including kippering, smoking, canning, and boiling).

PUGET SOUND

All saltwater areas east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, outside the mouth of any river or stream, including the Strait of Juan de Fuca, Strait of Georgia, Hood Canal, and all bays and inlets.

QUOTA

Salmon, halibut, sturgeon, and some shellfish are managed by allocations in many areas. These fisheries close when the allocations have been taken.

RAKE

A smelt or herring rake is any device designed to be drawn through the water to impale fish, but does not include forage fish jigger gear.

RELEASE WILD CHINOOK, COHO, STEELHEAD, OR CUTTHROAT

Means wild Chinook, coho, steelhead, or cutthroat may not be kept; only hatchery fish of the designated species may be kept. (See Wild Chinook and Coho and Wild Steelhead and Cutthroat.)

RESIDENT

A person who has maintained a permanent place of abode within the state for at least 90 days preceding license purchase, who has established by formal evidence (e.g., a driver's license and voter registration) an intent to continue residing in the state, and who is not licensed to hunt or fish as a resident in another state.

SALMON

Includes Chinook, coho, sockeye, chum, pink, and Atlantic salmon.

SEAWEED

Marine species of algae (such as kelp, rock weed, and sea lettuce) and seagrasses (such as eelgrass).

SELECTIVE GEAR RULES

Only unscented artificial flies or lures with one single-point, barbless hook are allowed. Up to a total of three artificial flies or lures containing single-point, barbless hooks may be used. Bait is prohibited; fish may be released until the daily limit is retained. **Only knotless nets may be used to land fish.** No one may fish from any floating device equipped with an internal combustion motor, except where specifically allowed under Special Rules for individual waters. If any fish has swallowed the hook or is hooked in the gill, eye, or tongue, it should be kept if legal to do so.

SHELLFISH

Includes Dungeness, red rock, tanner, king, and box crab; razor clams, and all other marine clams existing in a wild state; oysters, geoducks, shrimp, sea cucumbers, sea urchins, scallops, goose barnacles, cockles, mussels, squid, octopus, and crawfish.

SNAGGING

Attempting to take fish with a hook and line in such a way that the fish does not voluntarily take the hook(s) in its mouth. In freshwater, it is illegal to possess any fish hooked anywhere other than inside the mouth or on the head.

SPEAR FISHING

Attempting to take fish by impaling the fish on a shaft, arrow, or other device.

SPECIAL RULES

Rule exceptions to the statewide rules as listed in the Freshwater Special Rules, Marine Area Rules, and Shellfish/Seaweed Rules.

STATEWIDE FRESHWATER RULES

Rules that are specific to freshwater fishing.

STATEWIDE FRESHWATER SPECIES RULES

Rules for freshwater game fish and food fish.

STATEWIDE MARINE AREA RULES

Rules that are specific to saltwater fishing.

STATEWIDE SHELLFISH/SEAWEED RULES

Rules that are specific to shellfish and seaweed harvest.

STATIONARY GEAR RESTRICTION

The line, weight, lure, or bait must be moving (not stationary) while in the water.

STEELHEAD

A sea-run rainbow trout 20" in length and over.

STRETCH MEASURE

The distance between the inside of one knot to the outside of the opposite vertical knot of one mesh when the mesh is stretched vertically.

TROLLING

Fishing from a vessel while in gear, making progress under power.

TROUT

When used in the fishing pamphlet, the term "trout" includes rainbow trout, steelhead, brook, brown, cutthroat, tiger, golden, lake trout, and kokanee, as well as landlocked Chinook, coho, Atlantic salmon, and grayling.

UNCLASSIFIED INVERTEBRATES AND FISH

Invertebrates and fish not listed in the shellfish, food fish, or game fish definitions, such as snails, nudibranchs, shore crabs, graceful crabs, sand dollars, starfish, white and red sea cucumbers, limpets, chitons, lamprey, etc.

WDFW

An acronym for Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife.

WEIGHT

The weight of fish or shellfish before cleaning them and the wet weight for seaweed on which daily and possession pound limits are based.

WHITEFISH GEAR RULES


Fishing gear is restricted to one single-point hook, maximum hook size 3/16" point to shank (hook size 14), and bait is allowed.

WILD CHINOOK AND COHO

Wild Chinook and coho have an unclipped adipose fin.

WILD STEELHEAD AND CUTTHROAT

Wild steelhead and cutthroat have unclipped adipose and ventral fins.



Statewide General Rules*

Harvest and Possession Rules

You May Not:

Fish in closed waters.

Retain wild STEELHEAD or DOLLY VARDEN/ BULL TROUT except where specially authorized in the special rules.

Take, fish for, or possess PACIFIC LAMPREY, WESTERN BROOK LAMPREY, or RIVER LAMPREY, or use any species of LAMPREY for bait.

Fish for, or harvest fish or shellfish in an area with catch in your possession that does not meet the rules of that area. However, you may pass through such an area without stopping to fish. Also, you may catch fish in one area and land them at a port in a different area even if that different area is closed or has different rules, except HALIBUT (see page 102). See below for Canadian-caught fish.

Intentionally waste fish or shellfish. This includes mutilating or clipping fins and then returning to the water any live fish (such as DOGFISH).

Use SALMON, HERRING, or HALIBUT for anything other than human consumption or fishing bait.

Continue to fish for SALMON after the adult portion of the daily limit has been retained.

Fish for (unless authorized by Special Rules) or harass fish within 400 feet downstream of a man-made dam, fish ladder, or other obstruction, or in rearing, holding, or passage facilities.

Harvest any part of another person's daily limit, except for persons who possess a Designated Harvester Card.

Chum (broadcast feed) to attract game fish unless authorized by Special Rules.

You May Not:

Possess fish or shellfish that do not meet the minimum and maximum size limits, weight limits, or sex restrictions, or that are in excess of the daily or possession limit.

Possess SALMON or STURGEON eggs in the field without having retained the intact carcass of the fish from which the eggs were removed.

Possess another person's game fish unless it is accompanied by a statement showing the name, address, license number, date, county, and area where it was taken, and the signature of the angler who harvested it.

Possess or use live fish for game fish bait.

Possess DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT in the field in such condition that the species and total length cannot be determined.

Hold recreationally-caught fish or shellfish in storage by a custom canner, hotel or restaurant, or a cold storage plant without tags listing the name and address of its owner.

You May:

Clean or portion fish or shellfish while in the field with the following exceptions: It is unlawful for an angler to fail to retain proof of compliance with species, size, number, weight, sex, or wild or hatchery origin restriction, if such restrictions apply, until the angler is ashore and has finished fishing for the day. For all ROCKFISH species and for fish with a length restriction, anglers must retain the fish carcass until coming ashore to comply with the above rule. This does not apply if the catch is in the process of being prepared for immediate consumption.

Gear Rules

You May Not:

Snag or attempt to snag fish.

Use a net, except to land legally-hooked fish or a dip net for forage fish.

Use drugs, explosives, or poison that may kill or injure fish and wildlife.

Use any type of chemical irritant to harvest fish, shellfish, or unclassified marine invertebrates unless a special exception has been made by the Director.

Fish with a rod not under your immediate control.

Fish for SALMON, STURGEON, OCTOPUS, or CRAB in saltwater with underwater spearfishing gear.

Fish for game fish, SALMON, SHAD, STURGEON, or SHELLFISH with bow and arrow or spear.

Use a gaff hook, except to land legally-hooked HALIBUT, TUNA, or DOGFISH shark that will be retained.

Use a HERRING rake or a SMELT rake.

You are Required to:

Cooperate with data collection or other sampling of fish, SHELLFISH or SEAWEED upon request of Department of Fish and Wildlife personnel. This includes relinquishing any part of a SALMON, STEELHEAD, or other species of fish containing coded-wire tags.

Stop at mandatory check stations established by the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

Show fish, SHELLFISH, and SEAWEED in your possession and required licenses, Catch Record Cards, and gear being used, upon request of a Fish and Wildlife officer.

Fill out your Catch Record Card immediately upon retaining SALMON, STEELHEAD, HALIBUT, or STURGEON. For Puget Sound DUNGENESS CRAB, fill out immediately when fishing from a boat or dock, or upon returning to shore when wading or diving.

Return your Catch Record Card when you are done fishing or by the date printed on your card, even if nothing was caught.

Fish and Shellfish Caught in Canada

It is lawful to possess Canadian-origin fish or SHELLFISH if you have a Canadian license and salmon conservation stamp (for SALMON), except it is unlawful to possess Canadian-origin yelloweye or canary rockfish.

There are special rules for Canadian HALIBUT and SALMON. If you only fish in Canada, contact the Department of Fisheries and Oceans (DFO) or visit their website at http://www.pac.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/recfish/Opportunities/finfish_e.htm for updated Canadian regulations. If you fish for HALIBUT in Washington, the daily limit is one HALIBUT, and the possession limit is two HALIBUT, regardless of where they are taken. No more than one daily limit of HALIBUT may be possessed aboard the fishing vessel.

It is unlawful to possess in marine waters or land into Washington any fresh salmon taken for personal use from Canadian waters unless such salmon meet current salmon regulations for the Catch Record Card area where the salmon are landed, unless you physically clear Customs in Bedwell Harbour, Sydney, Ucluelet, Victoria, or White Rock, and get your Customs clearance number at the port. If you are in possession of salmon that would be unlawful if taken in Washington, you may not fish in Washington waters.

You may **not** land both a Canadian and a Washington limit of salmon on the same day (one or the other, but not both).

Buying and Selling Fish & Shellfish

You may not offer any recreationally-caught fish or shellfish for sale or barter.

In order to buy, sell, or possess STEELHEAD, sea-run CUTTHROAT, or DOLLY VARDEN/ BULL TROUT lawfully taken by a treaty Indian member, a person must meet the following requirement: the fish must be accompanied by a written statement showing taker's name, address, tribal affiliation, and treaty fish identification card number, number of fish, date, and location where taken. This rule does not apply to treaty members nor to game fish purchased from a fish buyer licensed by the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

FISHING OPPORTUNITY DEPENDS ON CAREFUL HANDLING OF FISH

SELECTIVE FISHING

Selective fisheries for hatchery-produced fish and catch-and-release fisheries are increasingly important to providing recreational fishing opportunities in Washington. To ensure these fisheries are successful, it is absolutely essential that participating anglers comply with all regulations and take great care in releasing unmarked fish to ensure the greatest chance for survival.

HOW TO RELEASE FISH

When you need to release a fish, there are some special precautions you can take to give it the best chance of surviving:

- Minimize handling by leaving the fish in the water.
- Do not net your fish – but if you must, use a soft, knotless net or rubber mesh net. Knotless nets are now required in fly-fishing only areas and freshwater areas with selective gear rules.
- Use a hook remover (dehooker) when hooks are imbedded in the mouth or jaw.
- If a fish has swallowed the hook, cut the leader.
- Keep fingers away from the eyes and gills of the fish.

SALMON and TROUT HANDLING RULES

FRESHWATER: “It is unlawful to totally remove salmon, steelhead, or Dolly Varden/Bull trout from the water if it is unlawful to retain those fish, or if the angler subsequently releases the salmon, steelhead, Dolly Varden, or bull trout.”

MARINE AREAS 5 through 13: “It is unlawful to bring wild salmon or a species of salmon aboard a vessel if it is unlawful to retain that salmon” (“aboard” means inside the gunwale of a vessel).

MARINE AREA 2-2: “It is unlawful to totally remove salmon from the water if it is illegal to retain those fish, except anglers fishing from boats 30 feet or longer as listed on either their state or Coast Guard registration are exempt.”




BROOK TROUT, BULL TROUT OR DOLLY VARDEN?



Why you should care.

Bull trout and Dolly Varden are native to Washington waters and are listed as threatened under the Endangered Species Act. Eastern brook trout are imported from other states and can negatively impact bull trout and Dolly Varden. All three species look very much alike and often live in the same waters. Eastern brook trout may be harvested in most waters, but bull trout/Dolly Varden harvest is limited to a few select waters (see special rules for details). Here's how to tell them apart.

Eastern Brook Trout



Black spots or "worm tracks" on dorsal fin.

Dolly Varden/Bull Trout



No distinct spots on dorsal fin.

The dorsal fin is the key to telling them apart. If the dorsal fin has black spots or "worm tracks," it's a brook trout. If the dorsal fin is clear or olive colored, with no distinct spots, it's a bull trout or Dolly Varden.

So remember, in waters that are closed to harvest of bull trout:

No black, put it back!

Statewide Freshwater Rules

Using Freshwater Rules

1 • • • • • Read:

The Statewide Freshwater Rules and Statewide Freshwater Species Rules. Determine seasons and general rules applying to the species for which you intend to fish. Remember to check for emergency rules, which can be found by calling the WDFW Fishing Hotline at (360) 902-2500, or by contacting statewide customer service at (360) 902-2700, or by visiting the WDFW website at <http://wdfw.wa.gov>.

2 • • • • • Choose:

The location you are going to fish and check that area for Special Rule listings. Special Rules are divided into four areas: Westside Rivers, Westside Lakes, Eastside Rivers, and Eastside Lakes. **RIVERS** lists rivers, streams, and beaver ponds. **LAKES** lists lakes, ponds, and reservoirs. For the purposes of this pamphlet, the COLUMBIA AND SNAKE RIVERS are rivers (not reservoirs), and any special rules that apply are listed in the Eastside Rivers section. See map below for additional information.

3 • • • • • If your area is listed in a Special Rules section:

Read Special Rules Instructions on the bottom of page 36. If your area is NOT listed in the Special Rules (pages 42-101), then all the Statewide Rules apply.

4 • • • • • The following terms are used frequently in the Special Rules:

Catch-and-release, Chumming, Daily Limit, Fly Fishing Only, Juvenile Only, Landlocked Salmon Rules, Minimum Size (min. size), Maximum Size (max. size), Night Closure, Non-Buoyant Lure Restriction, Selective Gear Rules, Release wild STEELHEAD, Release wild CHINOOK, Release wild COHO, and Release wild CUTTHROAT. Definitions can be found on pages 28-30.

Statewide Freshwater Rules

Tackle

Hook and line angling only. Barbed or barbless hooks may be used, and a hook may be single-point, double, or treble, but not more than one line with up to three hooks per angler may be used.

Single-point barbless hooks are required in areas designated as "fly fishing only" or "selective gear rules."

All fishing gear must be kept in immediate control and may not be left unattended while fishing. Rodholders may be used, but the rod must be easily removed without delay; rod may be left in holder while playing the fish. Downriggers may be used if the line releases from the downrigger while playing and landing the fish.

A club or dipnet may be used to assist landing a legal fish taken by legal gear. A gaff hook may not be used.

It is unlawful to chum or broadcast any substance to attract game fish unless specifically authorized in the Special Rules for individual waters.

Where use of bait is prohibited, or where lures or flies are used voluntarily, game fish may be caught and released until the daily limit is retained. If any fish has swallowed the hook or is hooked in the gill, eye, or tongue, it should be kept if legal to do so.

It is unlawful to possess a fish taken from freshwater that was not hooked inside the mouth or on the head. The head is defined as any portion forward of the rear margin of the gill plate.

Areas/Seasons

The following rules and seasons apply unless listed otherwise in the Special Rules. For all game fish and salmon, the Special Rules show **ALL** of the fishing opportunities for each freshwater area listed.

Unlisted areas fall under statewide rules.

Freshwater areas are open 24 hours per day when open.

All FRESHWATER areas are CLOSED to fishing for SALMON, DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT, Columbia River SMELT (EULACHON), and GRASS CARP unless listed as open in Special Rules. Fishing for COMMON CARP, WHITE STURGEON, SHAD, or forage fish other than Columbia River SMELT (unless specifically noted in Special Rules) is open only during open game fish or SALMON seasons.

LAKES, PONDS, AND

RESERVOIRS are open to fishing for game fish (except DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT and GRASS CARP) year-round.

RIVERS, STREAMS, AND BEAVER

PONDS are open to fishing for game fish (except DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT and GRASS CARP) JUNE 1-OCTOBER 31.

Sturgeon

Catch Record Cards are required statewide. **Annual WHITE STURGEON limit is 5 fish even if the angler holds both a Washington and Oregon license. GREEN STURGEON may not be retained.** In Columbia River waters forming the boundary between Washington and Oregon, STURGEON anglers may continue to fish (catch-and-release) after a daily or yearly limit has been retained.

Only one single-point barbless hook and bait is allowed when fishing for STURGEON. In the field, eggs must be retained with intact carcass of fish from which they came. **Night closure in effect for all STURGEON.**

Any STURGEON not to be retained must be released immediately. Oversized STURGEON cannot be removed totally or in part from the water.

Tagged STURGEON: Do not remove tags from fish not of legal size or not to be retained, but record: tag number and color, date, location of catch, fish length, your name and address. If fish is retained, remove tag and send with above information to WDFW's Region 5 (Vancouver) office.

"Open Listings"

An "open" listing does not authorize anglers to trespass on private property (which often includes the bed of the stream) or reservation lands. Please respect private property and reservation boundaries by contacting the land owner before entering these waters.

REMINDER: A fishing license is not a license to trespass on private property

Special Rules Instructions

The Special Rules (pages 42-101) list freshwater areas where the Statewide Freshwater Rules and the Statewide Freshwater Species Rules have been modified.

Unless otherwise listed in the Special Rules, you must follow the Statewide Rules.

For all game fish and salmon, the Special Rules show **ALL** of the fishing opportunities for each freshwater area listed.

The terms "**All Game Fish**" and "**Other Game Fish**" include the Game Fish species on the definitions pages, except DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT and GRASS CARP.

The term TROUT includes: STEELHEAD, BROWN, CUTTHROAT, TIGER, RAINBOW, LAKE, GOLDEN, and EASTERN BROOK TROUT; GRAYLING; KOKANEE; and LANDLOCKED ATLANTIC, COHO, AND CHINOOK SALMON.

County references after lakes or streams are noted to make it easier to locate the waters listed, or to differentiate between two places with the same name. They do not mean that the rules apply only to the portion of water in that county.

References in the Special Rules to "motors prohibited" means that fishing from a floating device equipped with a motor is prohibited. "Internal combustion motors prohibited" means that fishing from a floating device equipped with an internal combustion motor is prohibited. "Equipped with" means the motor is attached to the floating device, regardless of whether the motor is in the water.

In the Special Rules, all seasons for named lakes in Grant and Adams Counties apply to inlet and outlet streams. In Grant, Adams, Franklin, Okanogan, and Douglas Counties, you may fish up to the base of all man-made dams or other obstructions (in listed and unlisted areas), except Zosel Dam. Benton County rivers, streams, and beaver ponds are open year-round.

TROUT:

The combined daily limit for an angler that fishes in both rivers and lakes on the same day is 5 TROUT. In the combined daily limit, only 2 TROUT may be from rivers, except as provided for EASTERN BROOK TROUT.

Release of wild STEELHEAD and DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT is required year-round, except where retention is specifically authorized in the Special Rules. In freshwater areas (except in the Columbia River between the Buoy 10 line and the Rocky Point/Tongue Point line) SALMON, STEELHEAD, and DOLLY VARDEN/BULL TROUT to be released may not be totally removed from the water.


- Eat Fish, Be Smart, Choose Wisely.** The American Heart Association recommends eating fish at least twice a week. **Why?** Because fish are high in protein, low in saturated fat, and are loaded with omega-3 fatty acids - the building blocks for a healthy heart and brain. To balance the health benefits with the risks associated with contaminants in fish, such as mercury, PCBs, and PBDEs, remember to keep eating fish, choose fish low in contaminants, and follow local and state fish advisories.
- Statewide Advisory Due to Mercury:** The following advice is for women who might become pregnant or are pregnant, nursing mothers, and young children: 1) Consume no more than 2 meals per month of freshwater largemouth and smallmouth bass and 2) Do not eat shark, swordfish, tilefish, king mackerel, marlin, or tuna steak.

How to Prepare Fish to Reduce your Exposure to Contaminants



Prepare fish the following ways to reduce, by up to 50%, your exposure to PCBs and other contaminants* that collect in the fatty parts of fish:

- Consume younger, smaller fish (within legal limits)
- Remove the skin and visible fat before cooking
- Grill, broil, or bake the fish
- Let fat drip off during cooking
- Do not use fat for gravy or sauces

* Mercury collects in the fillet (muscle), not the fat of the fish, and is not reduced by preparing this way.

Puget Sound Crab Advice: Data have shown that crabs from industrial urban areas may contain more contaminants than those from non-urban areas and that crab butter (viscera) harbors more contaminants than crab muscle. DOH recommends that you consume Dungeness and red rock crab from non-urban areas and that you do not eat the crab butter. If you boil crab in water, do not use the water for soup stock, broth, or gravy.

Selected Washington Game Fish



Rainbow Trout

Body color is variable and may be silvery in lakes and reservoirs. It has a red to pink streak on its side and irregular spotting. There are no teeth on the back of the tongue.



Steelhead (Female)

Steelhead are ocean-run rainbow trout that run in both summer and winter seasons, returning after one to three years at sea.



Coastal Cutthroat Trout

Body color is variable. The maxillary (upper jaw bone) usually extends beyond the margin of the eye. The hyoid teeth are behind the tongue. There may be a red or orange slash on the underside of the jaw. Spotting is more closely grouped toward the tail. Sea-run coastal cutthroat return in fall.




Brown Trout

This trout's back is brown or olive with large spots. Sides are light brown to yellowish with large dark spots surrounded by halos of blue-gray. The tail has few spots.



Golden Trout

Coloration is brilliant and distinct with a green back and gold-toned sides. There are a few spots below mid-point of the body, and white tips on the dorsal, anal, and pelvic fins. Parr marks show on the side of the body.



Eastern Brook Trout

Dark green or blue with white belly; its upper body and dorsal fin have wormlike markings. Its sides have yellow and pink spots with blue rings. The lower fins are white-tipped and the tail is square.



Lake Trout (Mackinaw)

Dark gray or gray green above, with a light gray to white belly. Colored spots are absent, fins have small white borders, and the tail is forked. It inhabits large, deep lakes.



Dolly Varden/Bull Trout

This fish is olive green to brown above and on the sides with no wormlike markings. There are cream or crimson spots. The tail is slightly forked. Dolly Varden are a sea-run version, more silvery in color. Bull trout are found in Eastern and Western Washington.



Kokanee (Silver Trout)

Its back is greenish blue to silver with faint speckling. The sides and belly are silvery with no distinct spotting. When kokanee spawn in fall, their sides turn red to scarlet. The inside of the mouth is white, not black as in some salmon.



Whitefish

Coloration is light grayish-blue on the back with silvery sides and a dull, whitish belly. It has large scales, and a small mouth without teeth.


Largemouth Bass

This bass is dark green on the back and sides, with a dark, horizontal band along its sides. The belly is white. The large jaw, when closed, extends behind the eye.




Smallmouth Bass

This bass is dark olive to brown on the back with a white belly. The sides are bronze and have dark vertical bands. The small jaw does not extend behind the eyes.



Bluegill

The bluegill is olive green to bluish with a blue and orange lower body. It has vertical bars on each side and solid black gill opercular lobes.



Crappie

The body is silvery with dark spots. The fins have dark bands. White crappie may have vertical bars on the sides.



Yellow Perch

This perch has a greenish to yellow body, a white belly, and vertical dark crossbars on each side. There are no prominent teeth.



Walleye

Coloration is black to brown on a whitish background. The lower portion of the tail fin is also whitish. It has a dark spot on the first dorsal fin, but no strong cross bars on the sides. The teeth are elongated.



Bullhead

The body is darkish-black to brown. Its head is not as flat as a channel catfish. The cat-like barbels on its mouth are brown or yellow. The skin has no scales. There are no spots on the side, and the tail is not forked.



Channel Catfish

The body goes from blackish to silvery to white on the sides. There may be some small irregular spots on the sides. Its skin lacks scales. It has cat-like black barbels on the mouth and jaw, a flat head, and forked tail.



The drawing for lifetime privileges offers anglers and hunters an opportunity to receive complimentary annual recreational licenses for the rest of their lives. Applications for resident privileges are \$6.50 each; non-resident applications are \$12.50 each. Tickets have a 365-day lifespan, and will be eligible for all drawings held within that time. The schedule for the 2008-2009 license year are as follows: **June 6, 2008**, for tickets purchased between June 1, 2007 and May 31, 2008; **October 3, 2008**, for tickets purchased between October 1, 2007 and September 30, 2008; **January 4, 2009**, for tickets purchased between January 1 and December 31, 2008; and **April 4, 2009**, for tickets purchased between April 1, 2008 and March 31, 2009.

Tickets may be given as gifts; the purchaser can claim or transfer license privileges within 15 days receiving their official letter of notification. Gift cards are available on request. See <http://fishhunt.dfw.wa.gov> for more information.

Marine Area Rules

1 • • • • Season and Daily Hours:

During an open season, marine waters are open 24 hours per day, except as noted for night closures.

2 • • • • Quota Management:

SALMON, HALIBUT, and some SHELLFISH are managed by quotas in many marine areas. These fisheries close when the quotas have been taken. Closures will be announced to local news media and will be included in the Fishing Hotline and Shellfish Rule Change Hotline messages.

NOTE: Emergency rules may occur throughout the year and will supersede the rules contained in this pamphlet. Changes can be found by calling the WDFW Fishing Hotline (360) 902-2500 or Shellfish Rule Change Hotline (866) 880-5431, contacting statewide customer service (360) 902-2700, or by visiting the WDFW website <http://wdfw.wa.gov>.

Rules listed below are General Rules. Specific Area Rules are listed by area.

Species Rules

Hatchery **STEELHEAD** may be caught and released until the daily limit is retained. If a fish has swallowed the hook or is hooked in the gill, eye, or tongue, it should be kept if legal to do so. Wild **STEELHEAD** must be released.

SALMON - Barbless hooks only, except barbed hooks may be used while fishing from the Columbia River north jetty and Willapa Bay (Area 2-1) Aug. 1-Jan 31. **Only single-point hooks and a hand-held rod and line may be used in Areas 1-13.** Minimum size for **CHINOOK** in Areas 1-4 is 24", in Areas 5-13, 22", except no minimum size in the Hoodsport Hatchery Zone. Minimum size for **COHO** in Areas 1-4 is 16"; except in Area 2-1 after July 31 and Area 2-2 after Sept. 15, the minimum size is 12" for all **SALMON**. Other Marine Areas and species - no minimum size. Handling Rule: In Areas 5-13, it is illegal to bring a wild **SALMON** or a species of **SALMON** aboard a vessel if it is unlawful to retain those **SALMON**. "Aboard a vessel" is defined as inside the gunwale. Also see special handling rule for Area 2-2 for Sept. 16-Nov. 30.

WHITE STURGEON - Only one single-point barbless hook and bait is allowed when fishing for **STURGEON**. Green **STURGEON** may not be retained.

HALIBUT - Hook and line angling and spearfishing only. A hand-held line is permitted. Only one line with up to two hooks may be used. **HALIBUT** may be shot or harpooned while landing. May not be landed in a port closed to **HALIBUT** fishing except **HALIBUT** lawfully caught in Canada; angler must have Canadian license. See page 31, *Fish & Shellfish caught in Canada*.

BOTTOMFISH, TUNA, AND MACKEREL - Hook and line angling, spearfishing, and bow and arrow fishing only. No spearfishing for rockfish in Areas 5-13.

ROCKFISH - You may not land **YELLOWEYE** or **CANARY** rockfish into any port in Washington. Where rockfish retention is allowed in Marine Areas 5-13, the daily limit is the first legal rockfish caught, except that in Area 5 west of Slip Point, the daily limit is the first three legal rockfish caught, except at least 2 of the 3 must be **BLACK** rockfish. No spearfishing for rockfish in Areas 5-13.

UNCLASSIFIED MARINE FISH - Daily limit 2 per species of fish, except that the daily limit may not contain more than a total of two sculpins not included in the bottomfish definition.

SIXGILL SHARK - It is illegal to retain or remove **SIXGILL SHARKS** from the water in Areas 5-13.

Species Rules

FORAGE FISH - Forage fish jig or forage fish dip net only. Only one dip net may be used at a time. Gear must be held by the rigid handle at all times and may not be used from a vessel while under power. Holders of a disability license may use a forage fish dip net with a hand-operated gate. Jig gear may have up to three treble hooks or nine single-point hooks, not to exceed 3/8" between point and shank. While fishing in Areas 5-11 & 13, a second line using forage fish jig gear may be used to fish for forage fish.

You may use forage fish jig gear in Columbia River waters from the Buoy 10 line to the Rocky Point/Tongue Point line.

Possession Limits

MARINE AREAS 1-6: Anglers aboard a boat may only possess one daily limit of fish or **SHELLFISH** in fresh form.

SALMON - Two daily limits of fresh **SALMON**. An additional 40 pounds of salmon may be possessed in a frozen or processed form.

TROUT - Two daily limits of hatchery **STEELHEAD**.

STURGEON - Two daily limits in any form. Statewide annual limit 5.

BOTTOMFISH - Two daily limits in any form.

HALIBUT - Two daily limits in any form, except only one limit while aboard the fishing vessel. For **HALIBUT** caught in Canadian waters, contact Department of Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) or visit their website at http://www.pac.dfo-mpo.gc.ca/recfish/Opportunities/finfish_e.htm for updated Canadian regulations.

TUNA AND MACKEREL - No possession limit or daily limit.

SHELLFISH - One daily limit of fresh **SHELLFISH**. Additional **SHELLFISH** may be possessed in a frozen or processed form. See page 130 for Shellfish/Seaweed rules and page 131 for the shellfish health advisory.

FORAGE FISH (**HERRING, ANCHOVIES, SARDINES, SAND LANCE, and SMELT**) - Two daily limits in fresh form. Additional **FORAGE FISH** may be possessed in frozen or processed form.

OTHER MARINE FISH - One daily limit in any form.

Tackle/Gear Rules

ALL FISHING GEAR - Must be kept in immediate control, and gear may not be left unattended while fishing.

HOOK AND LINE ANGLING - Unless noted differently, only one line with up to 2 hooks is allowed. **Barbless hooks are required for all species in Marine Areas 5-13, except forage fish jig gear.** When fishing for **SALMON** in Marine Areas 1-13, only single-point hooks may be used.

FORAGE FISH DIPNET - A section of netting (maximum mesh size is 3/8" stretched mesh) distended by a rigid frame not exceeding 36" across and directly attached to a rigid handle. May only be used for forage fish or squid.

LANDING A FISH - A club or dipnet (landing net) may be used to assist landing a legal fish taken by legal gear. A gaff may only be used to land a legally hooked **HALIBUT, TUNA, or DOGFISH SHARK** that will be retained. **HALIBUT** may be shot or harpooned while landing.

DOWNRIGGERS - May be used with a line if the line releases from the downrigger while playing and landing the fish.


RODHOLDERS - May be used; the rod must be easily removed without delay; rod may be left in the holder while playing the fish.

ELECTRIC REELS - May be used if designed for sport fishing and attached to a fishing rod.

SPEARFISHING - The diver must be swimming or floating in the water while spearfishing. The use of explosives or bullets attached to the spear ("bang sticks") is prohibited.

In Washington waters where a saltwater license is valid, each angler aboard a vessel may continue to deploy angling gear or shellfish gear until the daily limit of fish and shellfish for all licensed and juvenile anglers aboard has been achieved.

Marine Area Definitions and Codes



AREA DEFINITIONS AND CODES

1. **ILWACO** - west of the Buoy 10 line at the Columbia River mouth, north to Leadbetter Point.
2. **WESTPORT-OCEAN SHORES** - from Leadbetter Point north to the Queets River, excluding Willapa Bay and Grays Harbor.
- 2-1. **WILLAPA BAY** - east of a line from Leadbetter Point to Cape Shoalwater.
- 2-2. **GRAYS HARBOR** - east of a line from the tip of the north jetty to exposed end of the south jetty.
3. **LAPUSH** - from the Queets River north to Cape Alava.
4. **NEAH BAY** - from Cape Alava north and inside Juan de Fuca Strait to the Sekiu River.
5. **SEKIU AND PILLAR POINT** - from mouth of the Sekiu River east to Low Point, mouth of the Lyre River.
6. **EAST JUAN DE FUCA STRAIT** - from Low Point east to the Partridge Point - Point Wilson line, north to the line from Trial Island (near Victoria B.C.) - Vessel Traffic Separation Buoy "R" - Smith Island to the Lawson Reef Buoy, to Northwest Island, to the Initiative 77 marker on Fidalgo Island.
7. **SAN JUAN ISLANDS** - all marine waters north of the Trial Island line (described under Area 6) to the United States-Canada boundary.
- 8-1. **DECEPTION PASS, HOPE ISLAND, AND SKAGIT BAY** - from West Point to Reservation Head eastward through Deception Pass, including all waters of Swinomish Slough and Skagit Bay, and the portion of Saratoga Passage north and west of a line from East Point Light to light on Camano Island (Saratoga Pass Light #4FI Red 4 Sec.).
- 8-2. **PORTS SUSAN AND GARDNER** - east of East Point Light-Camano Island Light line (described in 8-1 above) and north of the Possession Point-Shipwreck line (described in 9 below).
9. **ADMIRALTY INLET** - all waters inside and south of the Partridge Point - Point Wilson line, south and west of a line from Possession Point 110° true to shipwreck, north of the Hood Canal Bridge, and north of the Apple Cove Point-Edwards Point line.
10. **SEATTLE-BREMERTON AREA** - south from the Apple Cove Point-Edwards Point line to a line projected true east- west through the north tip of Vashon Island.
11. **TACOMA-VASHON ISLAND** - south from a line projected true east west through the north tip of Vashon Island to the northernmost Tacoma Narrows Bridge.
12. **HOOD CANAL** - all waters south of the Hood Canal Bridge.
13. **SOUTH PUGET SOUND** - all waters south of northernmost Tacoma Narrows Bridge.

Salmon Identification

OCEAN PHASE



Chinook Salmon

Large black spots on back, dorsal fin, and both the upper and lower lobes of the tail. Dark mouth with a black gum line. Average size scales. Silver pigment on the tail. Prominent teeth.



Coho Salmon

Black spots on back with a few spots on the upper portion of the tail. White mouth with a white gum line and dark tongue. Average size scales. Silver pigment on the tail.



Chum Salmon

No prominent spots on back or tail (small speckles may be present). White mouth with a white gum line and dark tongue. Large scales. Caudal peduncle (tail base) is slender. Silver pigment on the tail.



Pink Salmon

Generally large black spots on back and heavy oval shaped black blotches on the upper and lower lobes of the tail. White mouth with a black gum line and tongue. Very small scales. No silver pigment on the tail. Flexible (rubbery) lower jaw.



Sockeye Salmon

No prominent spots on back or tail (small speckles may be present). White mouth with a white gum line and dark tongue. Average size scales. Prominent gold-colored eyes. No silver pigment on the tail. Small teeth.

SPAWNING PHASE



Chinook Salmon

Chinook salmon do not display the conspicuous morphological changes of pink, chum, and sockeye salmon during the spawning stage. Typically, Pacific salmon turn from the silvery bright ocean coloration to a darker bronze color as they approach spawning.



Coho Salmon

In mature male coho salmon, the upper jaw forms an elongated hooked snout and the teeth become greatly enlarged. The male is generally brighter than that of the female and is characterized by the dorsal surface and head turning bluish-green. The sides of the males develop a broad red streak. In females, the jaws also elongate but the development is much less extreme than that of the males.




Chum Salmon

Chum salmon display characteristic olive-green and purple (calico) vertical bars on the sides of the body as they approach the spawning phase. Both males and females develop hooked noses and large canine-like teeth



Pink Salmon

As male pink salmon begin to enter the spawning phase, they develop a prominent hump in front of the dorsal fin, an elongated snout, and large teeth. Body color in both males and females darkens from a bright silvery appearance to a pale slate, brownish, or greenish-gray on the back and sides and a pale whitish color below. Small, oblong irregular black spots are present on the back and sides, and on the dorsal and tail fins.



Sockeye Salmon

Sockeye turn bright red on their body, and olive-green on the head. Males develop a prominent hump in front of the dorsal fin; the male's snout becomes elongated; and canine-like teeth grow out of the receding gums. Females undergo a distinct color change, but retain their body shape.

Atlantic salmon have large black spots on the gill covers and back, and rarely any spots on the tail fin. Their scales are large, there is no red stripe along the lateral line, and they have 8-10 anal fin rays. Atlantic salmon may be taken from marine waters during any open salmon season, and from anadromous (not landlocked) freshwater during any open salmon or trout season. Anglers may not, however, continue to fish for Atlantic salmon after a daily limit of another species of salmon has been retained. In landlocked lakes, Atlantic salmon may be taken as part of the trout daily limit. Seasons and size limits in place for trout apply to Atlantic salmon in landlocked lakes. Opportunities to harvest Atlantic salmon beyond those listed in the pamphlet will be announced to the news media and carried on WDFW's recreational fishing hotline. Please report sightings to (360) 902-2700.

Chinook, Coho, and Pink Salmon Identification

Chinook

Jaw- The chinook has a dark mouth and black gums at the base of its teeth. Immature chinook are known as a "blackmouth".



Coho

Jaw- The mouth is white and the gum line is almost white, but the tongue may be black. The teeth are sharp and strong.



Pink

Jaw- The mouth of a pink is white, but the gums and tongue are black, as they are in a chinook. It does not have "teeth" on its tongue.



Tail- Both the upper and lower lobes of the tail are covered with spots and silver is prominent.



Tail- The coho tail has just a few scattered spots, usually on the upper lobe, with silver streaks. It has a wide caudal peduncle.




Tail- The pink salmon tail is covered with large oval spots. It does not have silver on the tail. The scales are very small compared to other salmon of the same size.



Wild/Hatchery Identification

In order to provide salmon & steelhead fishing opportunities, WDFW and the Tribes have marked salmon & steelhead by clipping the adipose fin (a small fatty fin directly behind the dorsal fin). In areas designated "release wild <insert fish name>", fin-clipped salmon and steelhead are the only fish that may be retained. The picture to the right shows a wild coho salmon and a fin-clipped or hatchery coho salmon. Please be careful in releasing wild fish— they are your fishing future! For tips on the best way to release fish, please see page 32. In Marine Areas 5-13, it is illegal to bring a wild salmon or a species of salmon aboard a vessel if it is unlawful to retain those salmon. "Aboard a vessel" is defined as inside the gunwale. In Marine Area 2-2, it is unlawful to totally remove salmon from the water if it is illegal to retain those fish, except anglers fishing from boats 30' or longer are exempt.

Pacific Cod

Brown to grey body with lighter mottling. Three fins on back and a large "whisker" under lower jaw. Also called true cod and grey cod.



Canary Rockfish

Bright orange or yellow body, mottled with grey. Fins are orange without black tinge. Three stripes across the head.



Walleye Pollock

Body brown with mottling. Three fins on back. The "whisker" under lower jaw is absent or very small.



Black Rockfish

Body black or grey in color. Two fins on back. Also called seabass and black bass.



Pacific Hake

Body dark or silver grey becoming silvery below. Two fins on back, the second being deeply notched. Black inside mouth. Large mouth with sharp teeth. Also called whiting.



Quillback Rockfish

Body brown with yellow mottling. High fin on back with yellow mottling. May have freckles on head and throat. Spines on head.



Cabezon

Body olive green to grey with lighter mottling. Two fins on back. Flaplike cirrus on head. Small teeth.



Copper Rockfish

Body variable in color with light colored stripe along the rear. Two fins on back.



Lingcod

Body dark brown, grey or green with mottling on sides. A single long fin on back with only one notch. Large mouth with large teeth. Can reach five feet in length.

Do your part to protect orcas from harassment by following these boating guidelines:

- Slow down: reduce speed to less than 7 knots when within 400 yards of the nearest whale. Avoid abrupt course changes and keep clear of the whales' path.
- Do not approach or position your vessel closer than 100 yards to any whale.
- Do not approach whales from the front or from behind. Approach and depart from the side, moving parallel to the direction of the whales. Stay on the offshore side of the whales when close to shore.





Marine Area 8-1 Map











3 Steps to Safe and Legal Shellfish Harvest - It's your responsibility!

1 • • • Know the Rules (You could get a ticket)

Is the harvesting season open? Read the rules for seasons, size, and bag limits. Always check the toll free WDFW Emergency Shellfish Rule Change Hotline (866) 880-5431. Current harvesting season information can always be found by using the clickable map on the WDFW website at <http://wdfw.wa.gov/fish/shellfish/beachreg>.

2 • • • Pollution Closures (You could get sick)

Does the beach meet standards for healthy eating? Some closures are shown on the map on page 131. For more pollution closures visit the Washington Department of Health website at www.doh.wa.gov/shellfishsafety.htm, call (360) 236-3330, the Shellfish Safety toll-free Hotline at (800) 562-5632, or the local county health department.

3 • • • Marine Biotoxin and *Vibrio* Closures (You could get sick or die)

Is there an emergency closure due to Shellfish Poisoning (PSP/ASP) or *Vibrio* bacteria? Check the DOH website at www.doh.wa.gov/shellfishsafety.htm, call (360) 236-3330, or the Shellfish Safety toll-free Hotline at (800) 562-5632.

NOTE: Emergency rules may occur throughout the year and will supersede the rules contained in this pamphlet. Changes can be found by calling the Shellfish Rule Change toll-free Hotline at (866) 880-5431, contacting statewide customer service, or by visiting the WDFW website.

Licenses

A Combination or a Shellfish/Seaweed License is required for all shellfish (except CRAWFISH) and SEAWEED harvest. A license is not required for unclassified marine invertebrates even though daily limits exist. A catch record card is required to fish for DUNGENESS CRAB in Puget Sound. (See License Requirements, page 24).

Designated Harvesters

Persons with a disability must have a designated harvester card issued by WDFW if using another harvester to assist them with their catch. The person harvesting the catch on behalf of the licensee with a disability must be in possession of the designated harvester card while assisting the person with a disability. Both the digger and the person with a disability must be licensed. The licensee is also required to be in the direct line of sight of the designated harvester who is harvesting shellfish for them, unless it is not possible to be in a direct line of sight because of a physical obstruction or other barrier. If such a barrier or obstruction exists, the licensee is required to be within ¼ mile of the designated harvester who is harvesting shellfish for them.

Safe Handling Practices

- Water color does not indicate SHELLFISH safety.
- Rinse your catch in salt (not fresh) water. Quickly cool your catch on ice or in a refrigerator, and cook as soon as possible.
- Wash all SEAWEED before eating.
- Cook shellfish thoroughly before eating.
- Cooking, rinsing, or freezing **DOES NOT** destroy all pollutants. CRAB can also concentrate pollutants in their internal organs (crab butter). Clean CRABS before cooking. Eat only the meat.

Shellfish Safety

Eating contaminated shellfish or seaweed can cause serious illness or death. The only way to be safe is to "Know Before You Dig." Check the Department of Health (DOH) website www.doh.wa.gov/shellfishsafety.htm, or call the local health department. For shellfish safety closures call the Shellfish Safety Hotline at (800) 562-5632. For healthy meal information see the table on pages 38-39.

Don't harvest in areas that are polluted. It can make you sick. Pollution can come from many sources like sewage drain pipes, failing septic systems, farm practices, wildlife, and pet waste.

Don't harvest in areas with marine biotoxins (PSP/ASP) or *Vibrio* closures. You could get sick or die.

PARALYTIC SHELLFISH POISONING (PSP) & AMNESIC SHELLFISH POISONING (ASP):

- Can make you sick or cause death
- Can't be destroyed by cooking or freezing
- Are produced by algae that usually can't be seen
- Do not turn water red like the old name suggests

VIBRIO BACTERIA: In the summer, sea water often has high levels of naturally occurring bacteria. Unlike biotoxins, these bacteria can be killed by cooking. To avoid getting sick, DOH advises that you COOK ALL SHELLFISH thoroughly.

Possession Limit

One daily limit in fresh form. Additional shellfish may be possessed in frozen or processed form.

Tideland Ownership

Most Puget Sound, Hood Canal, Grays Harbor, and Willapa Bay beaches are privately owned. SHELLFISH and SEAWEED may not be taken from private beaches without the owner's or lessee's permission. Private tideland owners and lessees, and members of their immediate family (grandparents, parents, spouse, siblings, children, and grandchildren) are exempt from personal use daily limits when taking CLAMS, OYSTERS, and MUSSELS harvested for their own personal use from their own tidelands. Daily limits apply for all other shellfish, all other people, and all other beaches. Everyone harvesting shellfish in excess of the daily limit from private beaches for presumed commercial purposes needs a shellfish certification from the Department of Health (see RCW 69.30.010(8)).



Two different state agencies are responsible for two different types of shellfish closures. Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) is responsible for conservation closures, which are listed in the Public Beach list above. These closures are designed to protect and conserve existing shellfish populations. Washington Department of Health (DOH) is responsible for human health related closures, which result from PSP/ASP, *Vibrio* bacteria or pollution. These closures are in response to potentially life-threatening environmental conditions. It is possible that a beach will be "open" by DOH and "closed" by WDFW at the same time. In these cases, it is illegal to harvest clams and oysters. It is also possible that a beach is "open" by WDFW and "closed" by DOH at the same time. In these cases, harvesting shellfish may put you at risk for serious illness or death. **ALWAYS BE SURE TO CHECK BOTH THE CURRENT WDFW SEASON AND DOH HEALTH CLOSURE STATUS BEFORE HARVESTING ON ANY PUBLIC BEACH.**

Intertidal Shellfish Enhancement Program


PERMANENT RAZOR CLAM RESERVE CLOSURES (Areas marked with posts and signs)

Razor clam sanctuaries (Reserves) are ¼ mile sections of coastal ocean beaches located on three beach areas that are used to assist in the management of the razor clam resource. The three areas are marked with metal posts and are signed to designate a "no digging" area. The three areas are:

Copalis Beach Reserve - from a point 0.4 miles south of the Ocean City approach (2nd Ave.) and extending south for ¼ mile.


Twin Harbors Reserve - from the middle of the County Line Rd. approach south for ¼ mile.




Oyster Drill Snail and Egg Case

The shell is about 1½" with ornate ridges commonly attached to clam and oyster shells. Egg cases are yellow to reddish. A voracious predator of marine bivalves. It is unlawful to transfer Japanese oyster drills from one beach to another. (WAC 220-72-011 and WAC 220-72-015)













Spot Shrimp




Spot shrimp (*Pandalus platyceros*) are distinguished by four white spots on the body. Spot shrimp may reach 10" in total length.

Coonstripe (Dock) Shrimp



Coonstripe or dock shrimp (*Pandalus danae*) are brownish in color with brown lines and spots on the head and tail. This species may grow to 5½" in length.

Pink Shrimp



Pink shrimp (*Pandalus eous* and *P. jordani*) are small (less than 6") and uniformly pink.

Coonstripe (Humpback) Shrimp



The coonstripe or humpback shrimp (*Pandalus hypsinotus*) is mottled reddish-brown with some white patches on the head and tail. This species may reach 7½" in length.

Statewide Gear Rules - Crab, Shrimp and Crawfish

Caution

Sportfishing rules for crab, shrimp, and crawfish are subject to change based on allocation and/or soft shell conditions. Check the Shellfish Rule Change toll-free Hotline, (866) 880-5431; the WDFW website <http://wdfw.wa.gov>, or watch your local media for potential changes. See individual species listings (crab, page 138; shrimp, page 140; and crawfish, page 136) for seasons and other harvest rules.

One star trap, one ring net, or one pot is considered one unit of gear. The maximum number of units of gear that may be fished per person is:

Puget Sound: (Marine Area 4, east of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line, and in Marine Areas 5-13).

Shrimp: Two pots per person, and no more than 4 shrimp pots may be onboard or fished by any one boat at a time.

Crab: Two units of crab gear per person, and no limit on the number of units of crab gear per boat.

Coastal Waters: (Marine Areas 1-3 and in Marine Area 4, west of the Bonilla-Tatoosh line). Two units of crab and/or shrimp gear per person. Exception: Columbia River - three units of crab gear per person.

Freshwater: Crawfish: Five units of gear per person.

GENERAL GEAR RULES:

Every shellfish pot, ring net, or star trap left unattended in Washington waters must have its own buoy line and a separate buoy that is permanently and legibly marked with the operator's first name, last name, and permanent address (telephone number is voluntary). It is **ILLEGAL** to pull unattended shellfish gear with a buoy that does not have your name on it, and only one name and address may appear on each buoy. Any angler may assist the person whose name is on the buoy while he or she is pulling the pot. No fisher may set, fish, or pull shellfish gear from a vessel, in Catch Record Card Areas 1-13, from one hour after official sunset to one hour before official sunrise. **All shellfish gear must be removed from the water on closed days.**

Buoys must be constructed of durable material (no bleach, antifreeze, detergent bottles, paint cans, etc.) and must be visible on the surface at all times except during extreme tidal conditions. Personal flags and staff, if attached to buoys, can be of any color. Buoy lines must be weighted sufficiently to prevent them from floating on the surface.

All crab, shrimp, and crawfish pots must be equipped with a biodegradable device (rot/escape cord) and shall include one or more of the following:

- (1) securing the pot lid hook or tie down strap with a single loop of cord; or
- (2) sewing a 3" by 5" escape panel in the upper half of pot closed with cord; or
- (3) attaching the pot lid or one pot side (serving as a pot lid) with no more than three single loops of cord.

Cord used must be untreated 100% cotton or other natural fiber no larger than thread size 120. This cord, when attached as described above, must be able to rot away and allow crab, shrimp, crawfish and fish to escape freely if the pot is lost. A derelict crab pot without proper escape cord can attract and kill crabs for years after the pot has been lost.

CRAB GEAR:

The minimum mesh size for crab pots is 1½", and all pots must have two 4¼" minimum inside diameter escape rings in the upper half of the pot, except in the Columbia River where the minimum ring size is 4" inside diameter.

All parts of ring nets and star traps must lie flat on the sea bottom and may not restrict free movement of crab until lifted. Shellfish pots must be covered by water at all times while being fished.

Crab pots must not exceed 13 cubic feet.

All crab gear buoys must be half red and half white in color, and both colors need to be visible when fishing.

SHRIMP GEAR:

Pots must be constructed of either flexible or rigid mesh material (no liners allowed).

Entrance tunnels can be made of any size mesh material but must be located on the sides of the pot. The sum of the maximum tunnel widths must not exceed one-half the perimeter of the bottom of the pot.

Shrimp pots must not exceed 10 feet in perimeter and 18" in height.

All shrimp pot buoys must be yellow in color.

SHRIMP POT MESH SIZE:

1" Minimum Mesh Size

A 7/8" square peg must be able to pass through each mesh opening – see diagram, except for flexible (web) mesh pots, where the opening must be a minimum of 1 3/4" stretch measure.

Puget Sound:

Required for all shrimp pots during the month of May. Required in all areas open for spot shrimp after June 1st.

Pacific Ocean:


Required year-round.

1/2" Minimum Mesh Size

A 3/8" square peg must be able to pass through each mesh opening, except for flexible (web) mesh pots, where the opening must be a minimum of 1 1/8" stretch measure.

Puget Sound:

Allowed after June 1st in any area closed for spot shrimp, but open for coonstripe and pink shrimp.



LOST GEAR:

Do not attempt to salvage lost shellfish gear in Hood Canal without first getting a permit from the WDFW Enforcement Program - (360) 902-2936. To report lost shellfish gear, call WDFW at (800) 477-6224. If we can recover your gear and it is properly identified, we will attempt to return it.

Not all shellfish gear sold in Washington meet the specifications shown on this page. Verify that your pot meets these requirements prior to use.


