Updates: Mainstem and tributary

Salmon/Steelhead:

Columbia River Mainstem

Effective 12:00am, March 26 2020, recreational fishing and shellfishing in all Washington waters is closed until further notice.

Waters of the Columbia River falling within the Washington state border are closed to all recreational angling.

Fishery Reports:

Lower Columbia mainstem from Warrior Rock line upstream to Corbett – 65 salmonid boats and 7 Washington bank rods were tallied during last Wednesday's (3/25) effort count.

Salmon/Steelhead:

Mainstem Lower Columbia River

Sec 1 (Bonneville) – 1 bank angler had no catch.

Sec 2 (Camas/Washougal) – 6 boats/8 rods had no catch.

Sec 3 (I-5 area) – 6 boats/10 rods had no catch.

Sec 4 (Vancouver) – 4 bank anglers had no catch. 45 boats/76 rods kept three Chinook and released One steelhead.

Salmon/Steelhead:

Columbia River Tributaries

Kalama River – 10 bank anglers kept one steelhead and released one Chinook. 4 boats/12 rods had no catch.

Drano Lake – 1 boat/1 rod had no catch.
