Statutes authorizing the agency to adopt rules on this subject: RCW 77.04.012, 77.04.055, 77.12.047, 77.12.240, and chapter 77.36 RCW.

Reasons why rules on this subject may be needed and what they might accomplish: To address human/wildlife conflicts and property damage.

Identify other federal and state agencies that regulate this subject and the process coordinating the rule with these agencies: Several wildlife species are subject to USFWS regulation in Washington as part of the Endangered Species Act, the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, and other federal laws. Regular coordination occurs between WDFW and the USFWS, and state regulations are designed to fit within the parameters of the USFWS's regulation guidelines. In addition, the USDA's Wildlife Services branch works with many entities across the state to mitigate wildlife conflicts and damage. WDFW also regularly coordinates activities with USDA and has both an MOU and individual contracts with USDA for assistance with wildlife conflict issues.
