



STATE LISTED SPECIES

Revised September 2018

The Washington Fish and Wildlife Commission has classified the following 44 species as Endangered, Threatened, or Sensitive. The federal status of species under the Endangered Species Act differs in some cases from state status; federal status is indicated by: Federal Endangered (FE), Threatened (FT), Candidate (FC), or Species of Concern (FSC).

<p align="center">STATE ENDANGERED</p> <p><i>A species native to the State of Washington that is seriously threatened with extinction throughout all or a significant portion of its range within the state.</i></p> <p>The 31 State Endangered species are designated in Washington Administrative Code 220-610-010</p>	<p align="center">STATE THREATENED</p> <p><i>A species native to the state of Washington that is likely to become endangered within the foreseeable future throughout a significant portion of its range within the state without cooperative management or removal of threats.</i></p> <p>The 7 State Threatened species are designated in Washington Administrative Code 220-200-100</p>	<p align="center">STATE SENSITIVE</p> <p><i>A species native to the state of Washington that is vulnerable or declining and is likely to become endangered or threatened in a significant portion of its range within the state without cooperative management or removal of threats.</i></p> <p>The 6 State Sensitive species are designated in Washington Administrative Code 220-200-100</p>
