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SALMON TRIP REPORT INSTRUCTIONS

- 1) Use one form per fishing trip. All anglers on a boat can use one form. Please document EVERY hookup even if the fish is small or gets away.
- 2) **Target Species:** Circle which salmon species you are targeting. If you are hoping to catch any legal/open season salmon species, select "ALL SALMON"
- 3) **Date:** Record the date you are fishing (month/day/year)
- 4) **Marine Area:** Record the Marine Area you are fishing. Start a new form if you fish more than one Marine Area in a day.
- 5) **Angler Name/Wild ID:** Record your name and Wild ID #. This number is located at the top of your fishing license. This information allows Fish Managers to call you in case they have any questions.
- 6) **Species Hooked:** Please record a tally mark in the box associated with each fish you caught, either kept or released, indicating the species, size (Legal/Undersize), and adipose fin- clipped/not clipped status.
- 7) **Unknown Salmon:** Record a tally mark for each unknown salmon species caught and released.
- 8) **Turn it in! The sooner we get your data the better.** Hand each completed sheet to a port sampler if there is one at your location. If you don't see a sampler or forget to turn it in, fold this sheet in thirds, tape/staple it with the address side out and drop it in the mail. You can also take a photo and email it to VTR@dfw.wa.gov. Also available via Fish Washington regulations mobile app. at wdfw.wa.gov.
