




<p>Project Description</p>	<p>WDFW plans to accept the transfer of 300 acres for habitat protection and restoration in the Big Beef Creek watershed on Hood Canal. This is one of the largest, most intact watersheds in Kitsap County, valued by the community for its large mature forests as well as its stream and wetland habitat.</p>
<p>Project Benefits</p>	<p>Ownership of this property would support continuation of a current restoration project. Additionally, Big Beef Creek is the only system in Hood Canal where state and tribal fishery managers have enough annual coho salmon out-migrants to mark wild coho salmon for marine survival and harvest forecasts.</p>
