- 1. Catch Record Card Area 5, effective immediately through April 30, 2019:
  - a. Daily limit two salmon.
  - b. Release wild coho and wild Chinook.
- 2. Catch Record Card Area 6, effective immediately through April 15, 2019:
  - a. Daily limit two salmon.
  - b. Release wild coho and wild Chinook.
- 3. Catch Record Card Area 8-1, effective immediately through April 30, 2019: Salmon closed.
- 4. Catch Record Card Area 8-2, effective immediately through April 30, 2019: Salmon closed.
