leasons for this finding: This emergency rule is needed to close the Chehalis River and listed tributaries to fishing. Low redicted spring Chinook returns make them more vulnerable to fishing pressure. Spring Chinook stage in the Chehalis liver, South Fork Chehalis River, North and South forks of the Newaukum Rivers and the Skookumchuck River. Any incidental encounters of spring Chinook during game fishing could subject this fish to stress, injury, or death, which during a lear of low predicted returns could harm future runs. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.
