Reasons for this finding: This rule is needed to close the possibility of fishing activity in waters of the Green (Duwamish) River from the Tacoma Municipal Watershed Boundary Marker (1 mile downstream of Tacoma Headworks Dam) to the Friday Creek confluence. Based upon consultation with Tacoma Water, this rule is needed to protect water quality in the associated municipal watershed. The Department is in the process of making this rule permanent. Given the immediacy of the public welfare issue, an emergency rule with immediate effect is needed until a permanent rules can be developed.

WAC 220-312-04000R Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, effective immediately until further notice:

Green (Duwamish) River (King Co.): From the Tacoma Municipal Watershed Boundary Marker (1 mile downstream of Tacoma Headworks Dam) to the Friday Creek confluence: Closed Waters.
