Reasons for this finding: This rule is needed to remove requirements for the Columbia River salmon and steelhead endorsement within the Columbia River and its tributaries. In the Legislative Session ending April of 2019, the Washington State legislature did not approve an extension of the Columbia River salmon and steelhead endorsement. The Department is in the process of developing permanent rules. Given the immediacy of the issue, an emergency rule is needed until permanent rules can be adopted.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-220-060, effective July 1, 2019 until further notice: The fish Washington license does not include the Columbia River salmon and steelhead endorsement.

NEW SECTION

WAC 220-220-21000A Columbia River endorsement.

Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-220-210, effective immediately until further notice: Anglers are not required to purchase or have in their possession the Columbia River endorsement to fish for salmon or steelhead in the waters of the Columbia River or any of its tributaries.
