the river. There is insufficient time to adopt permanent rules.

WAC 220-312-04000X Freshwater exceptions to statewide rules—Puget Sound. Notwithstanding the provisions of WAC 220-312-040, effective September 1 through September 3, 2019:

Snohomish River (**Snohomish County**), from the mouth (Burlington-Norther Railroad bridges) (including all channels, sloughs, and interconnected waterways, but excluding all tributaries) upstream to confluence of the Skykomish and Snoqualmie Rivers: Salmon: Daily limit 1; release all salmon other than coho and pink salmon.
