There will be **one (1)** non-resident wild-take peregrine permit issued on a first-come, first-served basis. Applications will only be accepted after March 25 and will **not be accepted** after the opening date of capture in mid-April of each year and for

the year of the permit. The permit will outline detailed instructions on capture rules and reporting. **Wild peregrines may only be taken mid-April through August 31. Opening date will be stated on your permit.**
