Effective for 2020 only, Directors of WDFW and ODFW agreed to concurrent policy/rules; 75% recreational/25% commercial spring Chinook with tangle nets post update, 80%/20% summer Chinook with alternative gear only, ≤70%/≥30% fall Chinook in Zone 4/5 for gill net, alternative gear any zone and <2% available for alternative gear allocation, coho are prioritized by fishery segment and allow tangle net and alternative gear only, and barbless hooks are required; temporary agreement was stipulated to have no precedence for future joint-State agreements.
