

Guidance for WDFW grantees and contractors Contracts and Purchasing – May 18, 2020

Activities conducted by both grantees and contractors must meet the following criteria:

The activity can be accomplished with negligible transmission or suitably low risk as described in [Washington Coronavirus Hazard Considerations for Employers \(except hospitals/clinics\) Face Coverings, Masks, and Respirator Choices](#) (Washington State Department of Labor and Industries dated May 2, 2020).

The grantee or contractor follows general workplace requirements summarized in [Coronavirus \(COVID-19\) Prevention: General Workplace Requirements – Summary](#) (Washington Department of Labor and Industries Publication F414-167-000, April 2020).

There is adequate Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) available for staff to continually meet Center for Disease Control guidelines.

Grantees and contractors must follow cleaning and PPE instructions for the activity being performed as published by the Center for Disease Control. A copy of the [WDFW COVID-19 Staff Resources Master List](#) provides a link to cleaning and PPE instructions, and is attached to this document.

Grantee Specific Requirements

All field activities occur during the day and require no overnight travel.

The activity involves no planned contact with the public, or the activity is conducted where contact with the public is expected to be low and can be addressed using PPE and following Center for Disease Control guidelines.

Contractor Specific Requirements

The services provided by the contractor are authorized by the Governor’s Office as an “essential business” as communicated on the Washington State Coronavirus Response (COVID-19) website at: <https://coronavirus.wa.gov/what-you-need-know/whats-open-and-closed/essential-business>;

OR

The services provided by the contractor are authorized by the Governor’s Office according to the [Safe Start Plans and Guidance for Reopening](#) in effect in the county where and when services are provided.
