Notice of Chemical Treatment (CFT Legumine) For Invasive Goldfish (Carassius auratus)

Distribution Date: September 8, 2020

Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife (WDFW) will treat the isolated pond(s) near the south shoreline of West Medical Lake, Spokane County, October 6-9, 2020.

Product(s) planned for use: Prentox CFT Legumine Fish Toxicant (Rotenone).

Location of treatment(s): The treatment pond(s) are located between Fancher Road and the south shoreline of West Medical Lake (N 47.56162 W -117.70031) in Spokane County, WA. Maps below.

Reason(s): Eradicate invasive Goldfish (classified as "invasive/nonnative Regulated Type A species"). These pond(s) are currently adjacent to, but isolated from, West Medical Lake, and treatment is necessary to prevent Goldfish from entering the lake once water levels resume to full pool. This treatment will be conducted under permit:

1. WDFW's National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS) Management General Permit No. WAG993002, which expires on September 15, 2021.

Additional informational signage will be deployed at and around the treatment pond(s).
