

### **General**

- Support for Model E – 2 *support this model*
- Surplus hatchery eggs need to be shared within the bay hatcheries if they do not make eggtake

### **Commercial**

- Oppose any fishing in area 2T prior to Labor Day (weeks 37 or 38)
- Commercial proposal received via email 03.23.2021
- Commercial proposal received via email 03.31.2021
- Commercial proposal received via email 04.04.2021 that includes no fishing in Areas 2T, no fishing in areas 2U, 2N, 2R. or 2M until Oct 1
- Oppose gillnetting in Willapa Bay
- Commercial proposal received via email 04.11.2021
- No salmon fishing for 2021 season

### **Recreational**

#### General

- There should be no retention of wild coho in tributaries until escapement is met for consecutive 5 years
- Have only one female limit for Chinook
- Support for a 2 fish daily limit for all systems
- No Salmon fishing for 2021 season

#### Nemah River

- Chinook daily limit – 3 fish, only one female, release unmarked Chinook
- Eliminate Chinook production and raise more chum
- Increase North Nemah Chinook bag limit from 2 fish to 3 fish with only 1 adult hen allowed

#### Naselle River

- Revise regulations from August 1 – October 15 to prohibit the use of jig heads or twitching jigs to reduce foul hooking of targeted fish
  - *4 support this suggestions*
  - *1 disagrees with this suggestion (why take away a legitimate fishing technique?)*
- Keep the float rule until October 15 (float rule = bait or lure must be suspended below a float)
- Open upper stretch of river using the float rule
- Hwy 4 bridge upstream to attraction channel needs to remain closed prior to October 16 to ensure broodstock is met and help reduce landowner issues
  - *2 people support this suggestion*
- 2 fish daily limit for Chinook and coho. If marine area and rack returns justify increase by emergency rule, then we can increase in-season
- Maintain the 2 fish daily limit until the hatchery has sufficient adults on hand to meet eggtake then maybe increase the daily limit if warranted

- Prohibit the retention of all Chinook above the attraction channel to augment low wild stocks
- Reopen the section from Hwy 4 Bridge upstream to the entrance to the attraction channel during salmon season prior to Oct 15 starting August 16

North, Smith, Bear, and Palix rivers

- Open for catch and release salmon fishing
